Excess Workers' Compensation Insurance

Background:

The District is self insured for workers' compensation insurance. Routine claims are budgeted in the District's annual operating budget and paid as claims occur. The District also budgets a setaside/contingency of \$1,000,000 for potentially large workers' compensation claims. In order to mitigate loss due to extraordinary claims, the District purchases excess workers' compensation insurance for expenses over and above the \$1,000,000 self-insured retention. workers' compensation insurance policy's term is from July 1 through June 30.

A request for 2009-10 policy year quotations was sent to eight (8) excess workers' compensation insurance companies. Four companies declined to submit quotes for this policy. Three (3) companies submitted quotes. The companies submitting quotes offer the District several limits of liability as well as self insured retentions of \$750,000, \$100,000,000, \$1,500,000 or \$2,000,000 and limits of liability of \$25,000,000 or statutory limit.

After reviewing the various alternatives available to the District and with respect to the District's claims history, staff is recommending that the District proceed with Option #2 as described in the attached chart. Implementing this option represents a cost reduction of \$31,263 (-12.6%).

Recommendation:

Authorize staff to proceed with the acceptance of the excess workers' compensation insurance policy with National Union Fire Insurance Company (AIU) (Limit of Liability: Statutory, Self-Insured Retention: \$1,000,000, Deposit: \$217,414, Rate per \$100 of Payroll: 0.9846). In addition to the premium noted above, there is a 5% brokerage fee (\$10.870.70), for a total cost of \$228,284.70.



What Went Well

Hazard Abatement Inspections

All Staff members are participating in completing hazard abatement inspections. Completed inspections for June total 661 properties.

CERT

June 27, 2009, a luncheon and communications drill was held for CERT leaders. CERT Coordinator Bell and Administrative Assistant Louise Hoy coordinated and staffed the event.

Contra Costa County Citizen Corps Council CERT Committee (C8)

CERT Coordinator Bell was elected Co-Vice Chair for C8 Committee. This opportunity will assist in improving coordination and collaboration throughout the County.

International Association of Emergency Managers (IAEM) and Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA); National Preparedness Conference, Washington D.C. CERT Coordinator Bell and members of the SRV Citizen Corps Council were invited to present our efforts in "CERT and Amateur Radio Emergency Service (ARES) Integration". This presentation leads the way on developing collaborative efforts in alternative communications during emergency situations when standard communication is unavailable.

Fire Safety Trailer

The graphics design for the Fire Safety Trailer is complete. Fire Specialists Castro and French worked with design professionals to develop the artwork. The installation/application of graphics will be complete by July 15. See attachment for design sample.

Wildland 2009- PIO Activities

San Ramon Valley Firefighters and District personnel experienced hands on training at the 15th annual Wildland 2009 event at Camp Parks in Dublin. Over 400 firefighters and overhead personnel, from all nine bay area counties, worked with experienced instructors to learn the latest wildland firefighting tactics and incident management skills. This two day training provided an excellent opportunity for multiple agencies to work together in a controlled environment.

Many hours of preparation were put into the implementation of this training exercise, including the proper notification of San Ramon Valley Fire Protection District residents, especially those residing in the Dougherty Valley/Windermere community. 
