5. <u>BUDGET WORKSHOP</u>

5.1 Review and discussion of proposed Annual Operating and Capital Budgets for Fiscal Year 2019/20.

Chief Meyer provided an overview of the budget. Financial Consultant Campo reviewed the various funds and financial summary noting that property taxes account for the bulk of the District revenues and that salaries and benefits account for the majority of District spending. Financial Consultant Campo then went through the power-point presentation and discussed the potential Safer Grant and the District's unfunded liabilities, including workers compensation. Discussion followed as to whether the District should continue to obtain annual excess workers compensation insurance or set additional funds aside and go completely self-insured. The Board provided direction to maintain the excess insurance,

but at a higher self-retention amount commensurate with the amount of workers compensation reserve funds; and to conduct additional research and bring the matter back at a future board meeting.

Staff proceeded to review their respective division budgets and answer questions from Board.

Director Parker asked about hiring a Disaster Preparedness Manager and suggested starting off with a part-time consultant position then progress into a full time position if warranted. Director Stamey suggested coordinating with the City of San Ramon and the Town of Danville so all three organizations are on the same page. Chief Drayton has had discussions with both agencies stating that a part-time position will be looked at first.

Director Parker stated that CERT and the Citizen Core Council are doing good work in the area of disaster preparedness.

The budget workshop concluded at 12:45 p.m.

Director Parker stated staff did a good job putting this budget together, and the entire Board agreed.

Financial Consultant Campo updated the Board regarding excess workers compensation after having a phone discussion with our broker stating he can come back with quotes at a higher self-retention level that would carry a lower premium.

Mr. Reid spoke to them regarding the fact that school buildings are not numbered and, in an emergency numbered building would make it easier on public safety staff if they were called to incidents at schools. Mr. Reid also spoke to school board members and security staff; and now all District high school buildings will be numbered. The Board thanked Mr. Reid for his comments.

5. CONSENT CALENDAR

Director Stamey had a question regarding Consent item 5.5 asking whether the 4g modems were convertible. Technology Systems Manager Call replied they were and that the 5g is coming out soon but are not available now.

Regarding Consent Calendar item 5.4, Director Crean asked Chief Meyer for what kind of direction he needed from the Board, and whether the Board would like to pull this item per discussion at the earlier Board Budget Workshop. Chief Meyer confirmed that he would like to pull this item from the agenda.

Motion by Director Stamey to approve consent items 5.1-5.3; 5.5-5.7. Director Crean seconded the motion. Motion carried.

6. SPECIAL ANNOUNCEMENTS/PRESENTATIONS/GENERAL BUSINESS

6.1 Special Presentation by Engineer Brian Olson and Captain Demian Bannister on the IQuest Program.

Captain Olson spoke before the Board regarding the District IQuest program. Captain Bannister was also present. Captain Olson referred to the teachers in attendance who spoke highly of the IQuest program. Captain Bannister asked the IQuest students to come up to the podium and then provided their backgrounds. Board President Yancey presented certificates to the two students and thanked them for all of their hard work. Chief Meyer thanked the IQuest teachers in the audience. The Board then took a break to take pictures.

7. OLD BUSINESS

7.1 Approval to donate surplus apparatus 548, 547, 546 and 506.

Chief Meyer provided the background of this item and discussed which agencies might be in need of the surplus items. Chief Meyer stated that he wanted the Board to review the information and make the decision staying focused on agencies that are not paid and don't have a budget.

Legal Counsel Ross stated that the donations would be subject to our apparatus agreement for \$1 payment, and indemnification and liability release and taken as is.

Director Stamey stated he supports the program and suggested expanding the offer to other agencies. After further discussion, Director Crean moved to approve donating the equipment subject to soliciting interest from other agencies. Director Stamey seconded the motion. Motion carried.

7.2 Authorization to contract with ENGEO, Inc., for Underground Tank Subsurface Assessment.

Chief Meyer discussed moving forward with the monitoring at former Station 32. District Counsel Ross stated that buyers would assume any liability and emphasized the importance of disclosure. After lengthy discussion, Motion by Director Parker to authorize the contract with ENGEO for Underground Tank Subsurface Assessment at the former Station 32 site for an amount of \$71,800. Motion seconded by Director Kerr. Motion carried.

Subsequent motion by Director Stamey providing direction to staff to proceed with the surplus property sale at former Station 32 on Stone Valley Road in Alamo for private purposes subject to the appropriate disclosures of pending action with the Regional Water Quality Control Board. Director Kerr seconded the motion. Motion carried.

There was discussion of using Carpenter/Robbins for this sale, and Chief Meyer concurred stating that we have used them in the past.

10.2 EMS – Battalion Chief, John Duggan EMS Report of monthly activities.

EMS Battalion Chief Duggan stated that 670 incidents were responded to this past month; and highlighted the on-going project list in the board report.

10.3 Logistics – Interim Deputy Chief Jim Selover Logistics Report of monthly activities.

Interim Chief Selover stated that the exterior paint job at Station 33 wrapped up and conducted on-going preventative maintenance and repairs. Outfitting is also in progress for Type 1 Engines.

10.4 Fire and Life Safety Division – Deputy Chief Frank Drayton Fire and Life Safety Report of monthly activities.

Deputy Chief Drayton highlighted 651 new plan reviews were received; and 725 inspections were completed. Deputy Chief Drayton also stated that 489 residents completed CPR and AED training.

Director of Emergency Communications Pangelinan stated the District hosted the San Ramon Youth Academy at Station 31; and conducted San Ramon Police Officer orientation. Director Pangelinan also stated that the I-pad grant roll out was completed.

Subject: Property and Liability Insurance – FY 2019-2020

Background:

The San Ramon Valley Fire Protection District participates in the Fire Agencies Insurance Risk Authority (FAIRA) for liability and property insurance. This JPA is comprised of over one hundred fire districts in California and Nevada.

For FY 2019-20, the property and liability insurance premium is \$161,487, which represents an 18% increase (\$24,734) from the prior fiscal year and \$21,487 above the approved budget of \$140,000 for FY 2019-20.

FAIRA attributed the premium increase to a combination of factors: increased full replacement values of the District's apparatus and buildings (based on recent purchases of engines, ambulances and station construction costs); increased District payroll; and external factors related to general employment liability and the extreme wildland fire conditions in California.

FAIRA considers this a very successful renewal with property insurance premiums alone increasing 10-50% as a result of the California wildfires. FAIRA noted that many carriers are following homeowner's insurance policies by not renewing policies with any exposure to wildfires. FAIRA's nearly \$1 billion in values with a good spread throughout California and Nevada tended to mitigate the wildland fire exposure and the renewal in premium.

Employment Practices Liability Insurance (EPLI) continues to be a cost driver whether the claims are legitimate or not. Based on the current climate, FAIRA anticipates that it will get worse before it gets better. Since FAIRA buys a packaged policy that includes the EPLI, from year to year there are always other lines of coverage like Property, Auto Liability, Crime or Cyber that remain profitable and mitigate other exposures. This puts FAIRA in the best possible position to maintain the lowest possible rates for all members. Also, unlike Workers' Compensation, to date FAIRA has no experience modification applied to those with loss activity - that is a distinct benefit to the District.

Recommended Board Action:

Authorize payment of \$161,487 to the Fire Agencies Insurance Risk Authority for property and liability insurance for FY 2019-20.

Financial Impacts:

The premium amount is above the \$140,000 budgeted for FY 2019-20. It appears at this time the additional \$21,487 in premium cost will be offset by savings in other areas within the District-wide benefits budget; if this turns out not to be the case, staff will recommend a mid-year budget adjustment.

Subject: Innovative Claims Solutions Contract Extension

Background:

The District utilizes Innovative Claims Solutions (ICS) as its third-party administrator for workers' compensation claims. The District's agreement with ICS expires on August 31, 2019; therefore, staff recommends extending the agreement for three years at the fee of \$113,865 for year one, \$117,281 for year two and \$120,799 for year three.

Discussion:

ICS has been managing the District's workers' compensation claims since 2002. ICS' administrative fees are driven by direct salary and operating costs incurred in managing claims and a caseload of 150 open claims per claims examiner. For the renewal on 9/1/2014, the District had 68 open indemnity claims that required an allocation of 45% of an examiner plus administrative support and overhead costs. The annual fee for 2014/2015 was \$82,118, which equated to \$1,207.61 per open indemnity claim.

By 2017/18, the open indemnity claim inventory had increased to 87 open indemnity claims, requiring an increased allocation of 58% of an examiner and an annual fee of \$100,187. The requested renewal was much higher, at \$110,000, but ICS was willing to spread the necessary increase across three years. We entered into a 2-year extension, with a second-year annual fee of \$108,443, which equates to \$1,246.47 per open indemnity claim. The third year was projected at \$116,699.

Since 9/1/2017, the District has experienced a decrease in new indemnity claims however, the complexity of claims, combined with litigation, has not had a corresponding decrease to the open inventory of claims. Currently, the District has 93 open indemnity claims which equates to 62% of an examiner's time and higher allocation for staffing and costs across the board for supervision and more clerical support, etc. The proposed renewal is for a 3-year contract starting at \$113,865, with 3% increases in years two and three. The renewal equates to a cost of \$1,224.35 per claim. ICS' proposed annual fee for 2019/2020 represents a decrease of 1.77%

per open indemnity claim. Over the three-year period, the average cost per claim increases to \$1,246.47, which is an overall 4.2% increase over the three-year period.

Lastly, ICS is continuing to include language in the agreement for a mid-contract re-negotiation of fees, based on a decrease of more than 10% of new indemnity claims or open indemnity inventory.

ICS is proposing the following costs per year:

Current annual fee - \$108,443 Year 1 – increase to \$113,865 (a 5% increase) Year 2 – increase to \$117,281 (a 3% increase) Year 3 – increase to \$120,799 (a 3% increase)

District staff and ICS continue to work together closely to provide the care employees need in an expeditious manner so that employees can heal and come back to work.

Recommended Board Action:

Authorize staff to extend the agreement with Innovative Claims Solutions for three-years.

Financial Impacts:

Funding for these services were included in the adopted budget for FY 2019/2020 budget.

Quarterly Investment Report – June 30, 2019

Background

Pursuant to Section 5.3 of the District's Investment Policy, please find attached the Quarterly Investment Report for the three-month period ended June 30, 2019. The investments held on behalf of the District totaled \$80.5 million as of June 30, 2019 and are in compliance with the District's investment policy. Fiscal-year-to-date investment earnings are \$1.2 million, which translates to an average weighted yield-to-maturity of 2.08%.

The District's Budget Stabilization funds are invested in a laddered portfolio held by Bank of the West maturing at intervals from 6 months to 5 years. At June 2019, the District had approximately \$18.5 million of Budget Stabilization Funds under active management. These funds have earned \$322,736 fiscal year-to-date, which represents an average combined weighted yield to maturity of 1.95%.

Also attached for the Board's review is the retiree medical trust fund (CERBT) account statement for the quarter ended June 30, 2019. Since inception, the fund has earned \$7.8 million in investment earnings averaging about an 8.45% annual rate of return. The balance of the trust fund at June 30, 2019 is \$27,705,695.



Background:

Effective March 1, 2019 the Contra Costa County Local EMS Agency and the San Ramon Valley Fire Protection District amended the existing agreement for hosting electronic patient care reporting and licensing on behalf of Contra Costa County Fire-EMS agencies.

The amended agreement accomplishes the following:

- a) extends the term to December 14, 2022;
- b) increases the contract (and reimbursement) amount by \$169,162 (for a total of \$465,000);
- c) transitions responsibility for the current Zoll electronic patient care report (ePCR) licensing and contract management from the County to the District; and
- d) provides for a five percent administrative fee paid to the District.

The District will be invoiced by Zoll on an annual basis for hosting services and licenses issued to the participating Contra Costa Fire-EMS agencies. All District payments under the agreement, along with the administrative fee, will be reimbursed by the County utilizing Measure H funds.

Fiscal Impact:

The Districts revenue and expenditure budget amounts for fiscal year 2019/20 need to be increased by \$169,162 to reflect the amended agreement.

Recommended Action:

- 1. Increase both LEMSA revenue account 4250 and EMS division expenditure account 5250 in the amount of \$169,162, and
- 2. Authorize payment to Zoll for \$49,032.46 for the 2019/20 annual license portion of the agreement.

Background

- A. SRVFPD and COUNTY ("the Parties") entered into the agreement ("Agreement") dated December 15, 2016, to provide Measure H fiscal support to SRVFPD in return for hosting a LEMSA approved Fire-EMS electronic patient care record (ePCR) system on behalf of participating Contra Costa Fire-EMS Agencies
- B. The Parties desire to amend the Agreement on the terms and conditions set forth in this Agreement Addendum ("Addendum").
- C. This Addendum is the first amendment to the Agreement.

IN CONSIDERATION OF the Parties agreeing to amend their obligations to the existing Agreement, and other valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the Parties agree to keep, perform, and fulfill the promises, conditions and agreements below:

Amendments

- 1. The Agreement is amended as follows:
 - a. Effective date is March 1, 2019.
 - b. Extend termination date from December 14, 2019 to December 14, 2022.
 - c. Increase payment by \$169,162 to a new total payment limit of \$464,362. In accordance with the service plan.
 - d. COUNTY LEMSA will transition responsibility for the current ePCR license fiscal and contract management to SRVFPD as the Fire ePCR hosting agency prior to June 2019.

- e. Moving forward, annually SRVFPD will:
 - Verify the number of licenses required by each agency no later than March 1st annually and make any adjustments to number of licenses purchased with vendor in consultation with participating Fire Agencies.
 - ii. By December 30th, invoice the COUNTY LEMSA for two (2) Fire ePCR licenses at vendor cost plus a five percent (5%) administrative fee.
 - iii. By December 30th, provide COUNTY LEMSA a copy of final vendor invoice and list of number of licenses used by each participating agency for reimbursement.
- f. The COUNTY LEMSA will annually, by March 30th, reimburse SRVFPD for the actual cost of ePCR licenses for participating Fire Agencies, plus a five percent (5%) administrative fee, using Measure H Community Service Area (EM-1) Zone A and Zone B funds as follows:
 - Vendor license actual costs are reimbursed using deductions from each participating Fire Agency's annual Measure H Community Service Area Zone B funds.
 - Vendor license actual costs used by SRVFPD are reimbursed as part of Measure H Community Service Area Zone A funds.

No Other Change

2. Except as otherwise expressly provided in this Addendum, all of the terms and conditions of the Agreement remain unchanged and in full force and effect.

Approval of contract with Graybar/Contra Costa County Facilities Services

Subject: Division for replacement of light fixtures at Station 38 at a cost not to exceed

\$25,466.75.

Background:

Staff is recommending the District enter into contract with Graybar for the purpose of replacing all light fixtures at Station 38 with LEDs. Graybar is a local electrical parts/component distributor and is also a long-time participant of U.S. Communities, a non-profit organization serving the interests of government procurement. U.S. Communities helps facilitate state, local government and education agencies make purchases from existing bid awards through the use cooperative purchasing laws. Some of the project highlights include:

- Energy savings by fixture is over 50%
- Maintenance of lighting materials goes to zero expense for a minimum of 5 years (this is fixture warranty period).
- Life of system exceeds well over 20 years based on LM-70, which is a measure of lumen depreciation (70% of light output at 100,000 hour) fixture based on 10 hours a day, 7 days a week.
- Interior fixtures can all be dimmed to a conducive light level based on individual preference.

Preparation for this project included an analysis of the trailing 12 months of electrical expenses, a site survey by Graybar and three electrical contractors to assess current configuration, scope and project scope & specification. Three contractors submitted proposals, the lowest bid was Contra Costa County Facilities Services Division.

Recommended Board Action:

Authorize staff to contract with Graybar/Contra Costa County Facility Services Division for the purchase and installation of LED lighting at Station 38, for a cost not to exceed \$25,466.75, cost includes a 5% percent contingency.

Fiscal Impact:

Funds are currently available/specified for this purchase in the 2019/20 CIP.

Background:

As discussed previously with the Board, included in the District's Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) for 2019-20 is funding to paint four Fire Stations (Stations 31, 38 and 39 Annex).

Pursuant to the District's Purchasing Policy and in collaboration with the City of San Ramon, the District can secure a cost per unit equal to the amount proposed and accepted/contracted by the City of San Ramon. The contractor C & J Painting comes highly recommended by City personnel, and two other recent customers. Two other contractors were contacted for price comparison; one chose not to provide an estimate and the other provided a quote with a higher per unit cost.

The scope of work included pressure washing, scraping/sanding, repairing damaged trim boards, caulking, priming and back rolling finish coats as needed. The low bid for the project was submitted by C & J Painting.

All projects should be completed by June 2020.

Recommended Board Action:

Staff recommends approval of the following exterior paint project:

Amount not to exceed \$72,380 \$65,800.00 + \$6,580.00 (10% contingency) = \$72,380.00

Re: CalPERS Resolution regarding Region Change

Background

The District contracts with California Public Employees' Retirement System (CalPERS) for medical benefits for District employees and retirees, represented and unrepresented. The determination of the health premium costs is dependent on regions that have been determined by CalPERS. In January 2020, CalPERS is modifying the regions from five to three, and changing the nomenclature of the regions. Due to these changes, updated resolutions naming the District's new region are needed.

Discussion

Effective January 1, 2020, CalPERS public agency health pricing regions will change from five to three regions. Per CalPERS Circular 600-006-19, "...the new boundaries were adopted following extensive analysis of the cost of health care throughout the state, and employer and stakeholder engagement. The move to three regions will more closely align premiums to the cost of health care in the area. The nomenclature will also change to sequential numbering. In the new three-region model, Region 1 will consist of 43 Northern California counties, Region 2 will consist of 12 counties in the southern part of the state, and Region 3 will be comprised of Los Angeles, Riverside, and San Bernardino counties. Currently the five regions are Bay Area, Los Angeles Area, Other Northern California, Other Southern California, and Sacramento Area."

The District's new region will be Region 1 which encompasses all of northern CA. For active employees, the District will contribute 92% of the premium up to the second highest Region 1 Basic plan and for retirees, the District will contribute 100% of the premium up to the second highest Region 1 Basic plan. (Currently the District contributes 92% of the Basic premium up to the second highest Bay Area plan for active employees and 100% of the Basic premium up to the second highest Bay Area plan for retirees.) The Public Employee's Medical and Hospital Care Act (PEMHCA), the regulations that govern the CalPERS Health Program, require the employer to provide at least the same contribution for retirees as it does for active employees so the

resolutions indicate that the contribution amount for active employees and retirees are the same.¹ That said however, the District will continue to contribute 100% of the premium up to the second highest Region 1 Basic plan for retirees.

District staff met and conferred with the Union regarding this change in region name and agreed to the attached Side Letter agreement. District staff will also update the Non-Represented Employee Handbook.

Financial Impacts:

There is no financial impact anticipated related to the adoption of these Resolutions. The cost of medical insurance changes annually based on negotiations between CalPERS and the healthcare providers.

Recommended Board Action:

1) A motion to adopt a Resolution authorizing the change in CalPERS regions for Represented employees; and 2) A motion to adopt a Resolution authorizing the change in CalPERS regions for Unrepresented employees.

¹ PEMHCA Government Code 22892(b)(1). "The employee contribution shall be an equal amount for both employees and annuitants." GC 22892(c) continues on to say, "A contracting agency may, notwithstanding the equal contribution requirement of subdivision (b), establish a lesser monthly employer contribution for annuitants than for employees." It goes on to describe a specific formula for this contribution for annuitants, which must increase annually until it becomes equal to the contribution for active employees. The law is silent on the opposite - to allow employers to provide a lesser contribution for actives than retirees. CalPERS advised that an agency may contribute more to annuitants, as a matter of policy for that agency.

Subject: Ordinance Requiring Notice and Cost Recovery Associated with Monitoring

Utility Work in High Fire Risk Areas and the Deployment of Safety and

Infrastructure Protection Teams by Electric Utility Companies

Background:

Following recent massive and catastrophic wildfires, the California Legislature passed Senate Bill 901 that required publicly owned California electric utilities, including Pacific Gas and Electric Company and the PG&E Corporation (collectively, "PG&E"), to prepare written plans for constructing, maintaining, and operating electrical lines and equipment in a manner to minimize the risk or wildfire.

PG&E submitted its "Wildfire Safety Plan" to the California Public Utilities Commission on February 6, 2019. This plan, among other things, intends for Safety and Infrastructure Protection Teams ("SIPT") to support PG&E's work in high fire-risk areas. The SIPTs are to be comprised of individuals with training in fire prevention, fire suppression, and emergency medical response, and are to be located on-site where specified work by PG&E crews is conducted.

Due to the large-scale loss of life and property that resulted from wildfires caused by PG&E equipment, PG&E initiated Chapter 11 bankruptcy proceedings in the San Francisco Division of the U.S. Bankruptcy Court for the Northern District of California (Case No 19-30088). PG&E was also previously convicted of felonies for multiple willful violations of the Natural Gas Pipeline Safety Act of 1968 and obstructing agency proceedings in connection with a pipeline explosion in San Bruno in 2010, as well as failing to accomplish wildfire mitigation on its powerlines.

The District is the sole and exclusive provider of fire protection services within its jurisdictional boundaries. The District's service area includes a diverse selection of urbanized, rural, and State Responsibility Areas. The effective and efficient provision of fire and emergency response to these areas requires extensive logistical planning for the deployment of District resources.

Accordingly, there is a need for the District to be aware of PG&E's work in high fire-risk areas and/or the deployment of SIPT crews within its jurisdictional boundaries so that the District may preposition resources for the efficient allocation of staffing and equipment to enable immediate response to any emergencies resulting from work to be performed on PG&E equipment.

To facilitate this, the proposed Ordinance requires PG&E to provide 24 hours' notice to the District prior to PG&E's work in high fire-risk areas and/or the deployment of SIPT crews within the District, unless critical situations require earlier deployment, for which notice must be given at the earliest opportunity and no later than the time of SIPT deployment. The Ordinance also amends the District's cost recovery fee schedule to allow the District to recover costs associated with pre-positioning actions, allocation of District resources, and costs for responding to incidents associated with PG&E equipment or facilities.

Environmental Determination

The proposed Ordinance is not a "Project" because it has no potential for causing a significant physical impact on the environment and therefore is not subject to review under the California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA," Public Resources Code Section 21000 *et seq.*). In addition, the proposed Ordinance is exempt under the definition of a "Project" in Section 15378(b)(3) of the regulations implementing CEQA (the "CEQA Guidelines," Title 14 of the California Code of Regulations, Sections 15000 *et seq.*) in that the proposed Ordinance concerns a government funding mechanism or fiscal activity that does not involve any commitment to any specific project that may result in a potentially significant physical impact on the environment.

Staff Recommendation:

Adopt an Ordinance requiring prior notice of PG&E's work in high fire-risk areas and/or the deployment of SIPT crews and authorizing cost recovery to offset the District's direct costs in allocating resources in connection with SIPT deployment associated with utility work.

ORDINANCE NO. 35

AN ORDINANCE OF THE SAN RAMON VALLEY FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT REQUIRING NOTICE AND COST RECOVERY ASSOCIATED WITH MONITORING WORK IN HIGH FIRE-RISK AREAS AND THE DEPLOYMENT OF SAFETY AND INFRASTRUCTURE PROTECTION TEAMS BY ELECTRIC UTILITY COMPANIES

WHEREAS, the San Ramon Valley Fire Protection District ("District") is the sole and exclusive provider of fire protection, prevention, and suppression services within its jurisdictional territory, as determined by the Contra Costa County Local Agency Formation Commission and in accordance with the Cortese-Knox-Hertzberg Local Government Reorganization Act of 2000 (Government Code § 56000 *et seq.*); and,

WHEREAS, in the wake of recent catastrophic wildfires in California, and pursuant to Senate Bill 901and rules of the California Public Utilities Commission ("CPUC"), publicly owned California electric utilities are required to prepare plans for constructing, maintaining, and operating their electrical lines and equipment in manners that minimize the risk of wildfire; and,

WHEREAS, on February 6, 2019, the PG&E Corporation and Pacific Gas and Electric Company (collectively "PG&E") submitted to the CPUC a "Wildfire Safety Plan" for minimizing risk of further wildfires caused by PG&E equipment; and,

WHEREAS, among other things, the Wildfire Safety Plan proposes to deploy Safety and Infrastructure Protection Teams ("SIPT") to support PG&E's work in high fire-risk areas. The SIPT is to be comprised of individuals with training in fire prevention, fire suppression, and emergency medical response, and are to be located at the site that specified work by PG&E crews is to be conducted; and,

WHEREAS, to ensure the orderly provision of emergency services, there is a need for PG&E's SIPTs to coordinate with the local or District Incident Commander in the event of a fire or medical emergency, or both; and,

WHEREAS, in light of the catastrophic loss of life and property caused by recent wildfires in connection with electrical utilities, prior notice of the deployment of SIPT vehicles and personnel within the District would allow the District to preposition apparatus and efficiently allocate staffing and equipment resources to coordinate for any actions requiring fire prevention or emergency medical response by the District. Amendment of the District's current Cost Recovery Ordinance is necessary to authorize the District to recover the costs incurred by the District for such prepositioning and response actions.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED THAT the Board of the District declares as follows:

SECTION 1. 24-HOUR PRIOR NOTICE OF SIPT DEPLOYMENT

As the District is the exclusive provider of fire prevention, fire suppression, and emergency response within its service area, PG&E and any other electrical utility intending to perform work in high fire-risk areas and/or deploy a SIPT or similar fire suppression or emergency response crews within the District's jurisdictional boundaries shall provide the District with at least 24 hours prior notice of its intent to deploy SIPT crews and vehicles within the District. In situations in which critical or emergency repairs necessitate an electrical utility to perform work in high fire-risk areas and/or deploy SIPT crews in less than 24 hours, notice shall be given to the District at the earliest possible time.

Notice shall be given by such means so that notice is received prior to the deployment of the SIPT teams within the District, including contacting the District at:

Should an SIPT or equivalent crew be dispatched by an electrical utility without providing prior notice to the District, the electrical utility shall be subject to a fee of \$500, which is based upon commitment of District Staff time and equipment and the efficiencies of prepositioning personnel. Such fee may be revised annually by resolution consistent with the District's cost recovery procedures established by Ordinance No. 28, as amended.

SECTION 2. COST RECOVERY

The District's service fee and cost recovery schedule, as set initially set forth in Ordinance No. 28 as amended, is hereby amended to include the following fees for prepositioning and allocation of District resources in connection with the deployment of SIPT crews within the District. Unless otherwise indicated, the District's standard fees and cost recovery schedule shall apply to emergency response to incidents pertaining to or resulting from work performed by electric utilities.

The District's rates for preposition and allocating resources in connection with the monitoring of work performed by PG&E in high fire-risk areas and/or deployment of SIPT crews within the District shall include:

• A District administrative fee correlated to costs resulting from the deployment of District fire suppression of fire prevention personnel for prepositioning actions associated with SIPT deployment and/or to monitor work performed by PG&E or any other electrical utility in high fire-risk areas within the District's jurisdictional boundaries.

All costs resulting from fire suppression, fire prevention, emergency medical response, and
emergency medical transport activities resulting from incidents caused by electrical
equipment or facilities owned or operated by electrical utility providers, at the hourly and
flat rates established in the District's Service Rate Schedule and Equipment Rate Schedule
pursuant to Ordinance 28, as amended.

All other fees in the District's Cost Recovery Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect. The fees and charges set forth in this Ordinance are subject to an annual cost-of-living increase based on the Consumer Price Index (CPI) of the Urban Consumers San Francisco-Oakland Area as developed by the Bureau of Labor Statistics of the U.S. Department of Labor or two percent (2%), whichever is greater. This annual inflationary adjustment shall occur automatically on July 1st of each year. Further, the fees or charges set forth in this Ordinance may from time to time supplemented, altered, or additional fees may be added in order to offset the District's direct costs of rendering services, with such changes being performed either by Resolution or Ordinance of the District Board of Directors.

SECTION 3. SEVERABILITY

If any section, subsection, subdivision, paragraph, sentence, clause, phrase or word in this Ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or otherwise invalid, such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining provisions of this Ordinance. The Board hereby declares that it would have passed each section, subsection, subdivision, paragraph, sentence, clause, phrase or word of this Ordinance regardless of the unconstitutionality or invalidity of any other section, subsection, subdivision, paragraph, sentence, clause, phrase or word herein.

SECTION 4. ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION

This Ordinance is not a "Project" because it has no potential for causing a significant physical impact on the environment and therefore is not subject to review under the California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA," Public Resources Code Section 21000 *et seq.*). In addition, the proposed Ordinance is exempt under the definition of a "Project" in Section 15378(b)(3) of the regulations implementing CEQA (the "CEQA Guidelines," Title 14 of the California Code of Regulations, Sections 15000 *et seq.*), in that the proposed Ordinance concerns a government funding mechanism or fiscal activity that does not involve any commitment to any specific project that may result in a potentially significant physical impact on the environment.

SECTION 5. EFFECTIVE DATE

This Ordinance shall take effect and be in full force 30 days after its final passage and adoption.

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE SAN RAMON VALLEY FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT, ACKNOWLEDGING RECEIPT OF A REPORT MADE BY THE FIRE CHIEF OF THE SAN RAMON VALLEY FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT REGARDING THE INSPECTION OF CERTAIN OCCUPANCIES REQUIRED TO PERFORM ANNUAL INSPECTIONS IN SUCH OCCUPANCIES PURSUANT TO SECTIONS 13146.2 AND 13146.3 OF THE CALIFORNIA HEALTH AND SAFETY CODE.

WHEREAS, California Health & Safety Code Section 13146.4 was added in 2018 and became effective on September 27, 2018.

WHEREAS, California Health & Safety Code Sections 13146.2 and 13146.3 requires all fire departments, including the San Ramon Valley Fire Protection District, that provide fire protection services to perform annual inspections in every building used as a public or private school, hotel, motel, lodging house, apartment house, and certain residential care facilities for compliance with building standards, as provided and,

WHEREAS, California Health & Safety Code Section 13146.2 requires all fire departments, including the San Ramon Valley Fire Protection District, that provide fire protection services to report annually to its administering authority on its compliance with Sections 13146.2 and 13146.3 and,

WHEREAS, the Board of the San Ramon Valley Fire Protection District intends this Resolution to fulfill the requirements of the California Health & Safety Code regarding acknowledgment of the San Ramon Valley Fire Protection District's compliance with California Health and Sections 13146.2 and 13146.3.2

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of the San Ramon Valley Fire Protection District expressly acknowledges the measure of compliance of the San Ramon Valley Fire Protection District with California Health and Safety Code Sections 13146.2 and 13146.3 in the area encompassed by the District of the San Ramon Valley, as follows:

A. EDUCATIONAL GROUP E OCCUPANCIES:

Educational Group E occupancies are generally those public and private schools, used by more than six persons at any one time for educational purposes through the 12th grade. Within the District of the San Ramon Valley, there lie 133 Group E occupancies, buildings, structures and/or facilities.

During calendar/fiscal year 2018, the San Ramon Valley Fire Protection District completed the annual inspection of 133 Group E occupancies, buildings, structures and/or facilities. This is a compliance rate of 100 % for this reporting period.

Additional items of note regarding this compliance rate can be found in the accompanying staff report for this resolution.

B. RESIDENTIAL GROUP R OCCUPANCIES:

Residential Group R occupancies, for the purposes of this Resolution, are generally those occupancies containing sleeping units, and include hotels, motels, apartments (three units or more), etc. as well as other residential occupancies (including a number of residential care facilities). These residential care facilities have a number of different sub-classifications, and they may contain residents or clients that have a range of needs, including those related to custodial care, mobility impairments, cognitive disabilities, etc.

The residents may also be non-ambulatory or bedridden. Within the District of the San Ramon Valley, there lie 267 Group R (and their associated sub-categories) occupancies of this nature.

During calendar/fiscal year 2018, the San Ramon Valley Fire Protection District completed the annual inspection of 267 Group R occupancies, buildings, structures and/or facilities. This is a compliance rate of 100 % for this reporting period.

Good afternoon

For those of you who are not familiar with the policies and practices relating to EMS "Event Reporting," it is a process that allows anyone in the EMS system, as well as individuals from the community, to formally report their observations or concerns regarding the delivery of EMS services. Historically, the vast majority of Event Reports have been generated by EMS personnel sounding an alarm of potentially substandard patient care, or the unprofessional conduct of other EMS personnel that they reportedly witnessed. It is a rare occurrence when the District receives notification that an Event Report has been filed in relation to our personnel and/or our delivery of our EMS services. Those that have been received in the last few years were all subsequently deemed unfounded.

It is even more infrequent when an Event Report is generated in Contra Costa County, where unsolicited praise is expressed for the elevated level of performance executed by EMS field personnel. Such an Event Report was filed yesterday by a staff member at John Muir Hospital, relating to our personnel assigned to Rescue-Medic 31. I have included the original Event Report below for your review, with the narrative highlighted in blue.

In this incident, Firefighter Fredrick Rincon #406 went above and beyond what formal policy establishes as acceptable performance. As a result of his efforts, the critical performance of EMS system personnel responsible for the downstream care of the patient and his family in this unfortunate fatal accident, were greatly enhanced. While the benchmarked superior level of patient care practiced by our crews every day and on every call, may routinely go unacknowledged by the general public, it is routinely witnessed by our peers, supervisors, and District leaders. Thank you not only to Firefighter Rincon, but to all of our District personnel, for performing at a level unmatched by the personnel at any other EMS provider agency.
