- Alert, Notification and Communications Report:
  - Denton Carlson presented the following:
  - o Transitions over to ATT FirstNet have taken place for the City of San Ramon and San Ramon Valley Fire. Town of Danville is in the works to make this update/change.
  - A congressional mandate has been issued and the City of San Ramon has tested the phones
    with FirstNet and did experience any dropped calls. FirstNet allows all agencies to come
    onto the FirstNet network while others will be dropped who do not use it. This enhances
    the ability to communicate and take of Emergency Response.
- 6. Training Education and Publications Committee Report

#### Training

- o Jeff Hebel presented the following.
  - The CCC TAC is proposing that our next year project be centered around emergency water distribution Water POD (Points of Distribution). Five sites have been identified for water distribution. Next step is to test the manifolds/PODS. We will be using a two pronged effort large scale points of distribution and personal water storage. At our next PAC we will have the equipment needed for POD distribution and a model for personal water storage.
    - o Danville Area five placements for the PODS
    - City of San Ramon five area of placements for the PODS
  - Ken Mintz would like to see how we communicate with and within these sites. What about people who cannot get to these PODS?
  - There are standards through FEMA, but overall we are leading the way with this POD idea.
  - CERT and Danville PD/VIPS has been informed about this project. Larry Fong may be able to carry forward to the County Search and Rescue Team. If not TAC will find someone to deliver the presentation.
  - Candance wanted to make that Alamo is included as we build this idea. Having a POD of their own placed in Alamo.

- We have acquired \$8,000 donation from San Ramon Regional Foundation. We've been asked by Via Heart to match that from our Citizen Corps Council as the two major sponsors.
