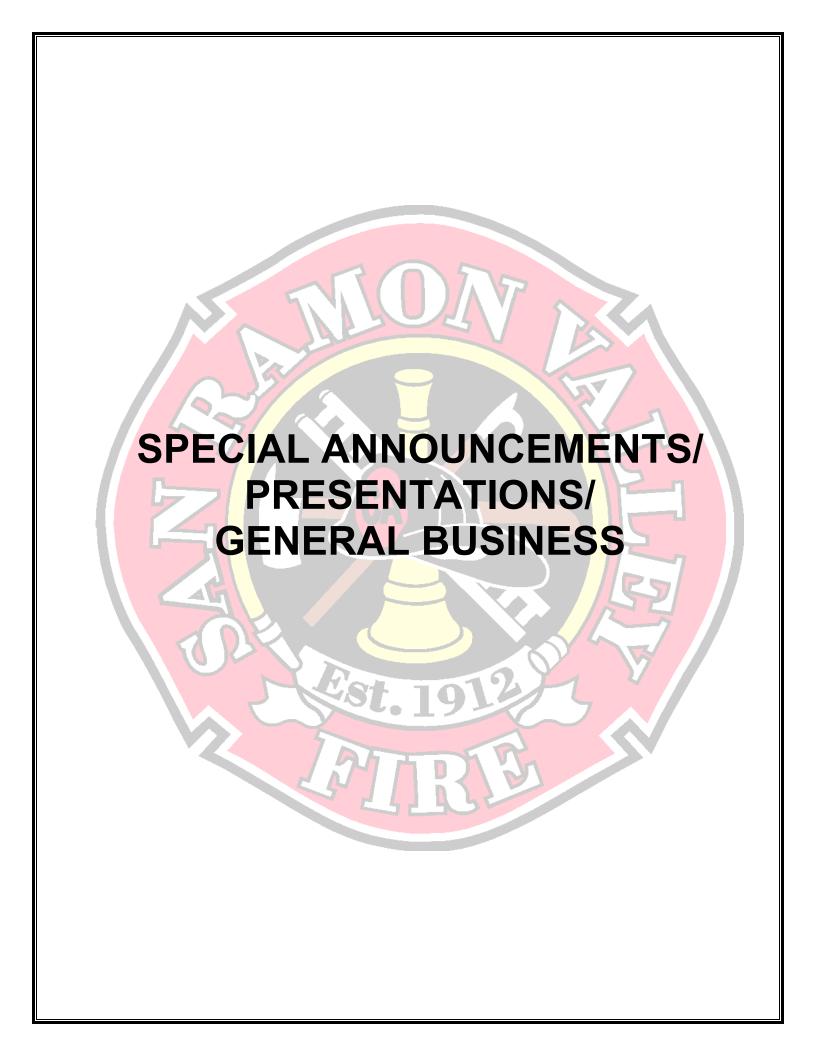

Reimbursement of Underground Tank Removal Costs

Background:

During 2014, the District initiated proceedings under the Surplus Land Act (the "Act") (Government Code section 54222 *et seq.*) to declare surplus for District purposes, real property which it had acquired in 2006. The Hemme Property (the "Property") is located at the street address of 1193 Danville Boulevard within Alamo, California, an unincorporated portion of Contra Costa County (the "County").

The Alamo Municipal Advisory Council ("Alamo MAC") recommended to the County that it purchase the Property for use as a park. After compliance with the Act, which included an appraisal of the Property accomplished by Carpenter/Robbins (which determined the value to be \$650,000 as of January 23, 2014), the District agreed to a purchase and sale agreement to transfer the Property to the County for use as a park. The sales price was \$740,000.

After the sale of the property to the County, an old, underground fuel tank was discovered on the property. The underground tank needed to be removed in order for the property to be used as a park, and the District agreed to contribute \$150,000 toward the cost of removal.

Recommended Board Action:

Staff recommends approval of a payment in the amount of \$150,000 to the County for reimbursement of underground tank removal costs associated with the Hemme property.

Financial Impacts:

Funding for the payment is available in the FY 2020/21 Capital Improvement Program budget; therefore, no additional appropriations are needed for this payment.

Subject: Purchase of Pierce 2100 Gallon Water Tender

Background:

Staff has determined that a Water Tender initially purchased and placed in service in 1982 has reached the end of its service life. The District's Apparatus Committee was tasked with researching whether refurbishing the 1982 Water Tender was more economically feasible than purchasing a new Water Tender. After an in-depth review of the cost associated with refurbishing the existing Water Tender, it was ultimately determined that for roughly the same price the District could purchase a new, stock Water Tender from Pierce Manufacturing that would meet the District's operational specifications and requirements.

Staff was able to leverage the HGAC purchasing consortium program as well as Pierce's prepayment discount program to lower the overall cost of the Water Tender to under \$300,000 as detailed below. To the extent possible, equipment from the old unit will be utilized on the replacement unit. The overall cost, including equipment and a 5% contingency, would be as follows:

Goal 1

Distribution of Fire Stations for Built-up Urban Areas of Greater than 2,000 People per Square Mile

To treat and transport medical patients and control small fires, the first-due unit should arrive within 7 minutes total response time, 90 percent of the time from the receipt of the call in fire dispatch. Total response time equates to 1 minute dispatch time, 2 minute crew turnout time and 4 minutes travel time spacing for single units.

Goal 2

Distribution of Fire Stations for Suburban Areas of 1,000 to 2,000 People per Square Mile

The first-due fire unit should arrive within 8 minutes total response time, 90 percent of the time.

Goal 3

Distribution of Fire Stations for Rural Areas of Less than 1,000 People per Square Mile

The first-due fire unit should arrive within 15 minutes total response time, 90 percent of the time.

Goal 4

Effective Response Force (First Alarm) for Urban Areas of Greater than 2,000 People per Square Mile

To confine fires near the room of origin and to treat up to 5 medical patients at once, a multiple-unit response of at least 15 personnel should arrive within 13 minutes total response time from the time of 911 call receipt, 90 percent of the time. This equates to 1 minute dispatch time, 2 minutes crew turnout time and 10 minutes travel time spacing for multiple units. Suburban areas should receive the full first alarm within 14 minutes total response time, 90 percent of the time with the goal to limit the fire spread to the area already involved upon the arrival of the effective response force. For rural areas, this should be 21 minutes, 90 percent of the time. Outcome goals in these areas would be to confine fires to the building of origin and to care for medical patients.

Goal 5

Hazardous Materials Response

Respond to hazardous materials emergencies with enough trained personnel to protect the community from the hazards associated with the release of hazardous and toxic materials. Achieve a total response time consistent with Goal 1, Goal 2 and Goal 3 with the first company capable of operating at the California OSHA First Responder Operations (FRO) level. After size-up and scene evaluation is complete, a determination will be made whether to request the on-duty District Hazardous Materials Team and/or other appropriate resources.

Goal 6

Technical Rescue

Respond to technical rescue emergencies with enough trained personnel to facilitate a successful rescue. Achieve a total response time consistent with Goal 1, Goal 2 and Goal 3 with the first company capable of operating at the California Rescue System 1 (RS1) level. After size-up and scene evaluation is complete, a determination will be made whether to request the on-duty District Rescue Team and/or other appropriate resources.




A concentrated focus will be placed on systems, training and feedback measures to crews to lower dispatch and turnout time reflex measures to national best practices of 1 minute for dispatch and 2 minutes for fire crew turnout, 90 percent of the time.


Effective Response Force for Advanced Life Support (ALS) Medical Emergencies


To treat medical patients requiring advanced procedures and skills (defined as Charlie, Delta or Echo), a two-unit response consisting of one paramedic-staffed ambulance and one additional paramedic-staffed unit for a response force of at least five personnel should arrive within 6 minutes travel time in urban areas and 7 minutes travel time in suburban areas, 90 percent of the time. For rural areas, excluding Mt. Diablo State Park, personnel should arrive within 18 minutes travel time 90 percent of the time.






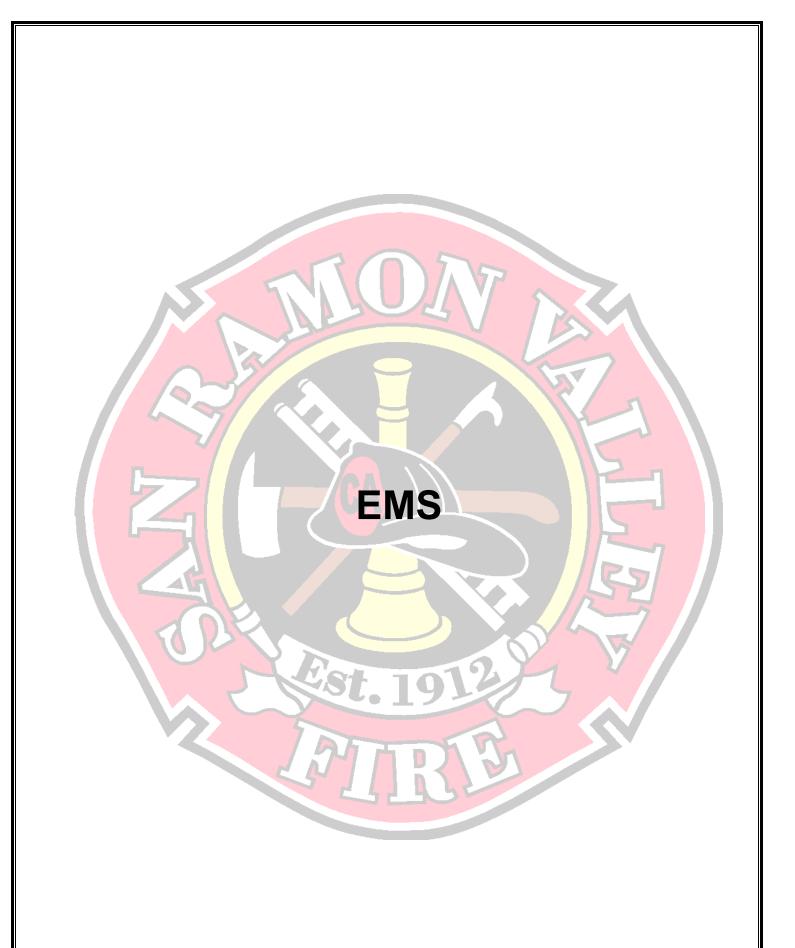




Figure 1: Windows Security Overview




Figure 2: Automated Alert Scorecard (Mar 2021)




Figure 3: Apparatus Connectivity Report (Mar 2021)








Figure 4: MDC Monitoring Portal




Figure 5: Station Alerting Monitoring Portal (Zetron)




Figure 6: Backup Report


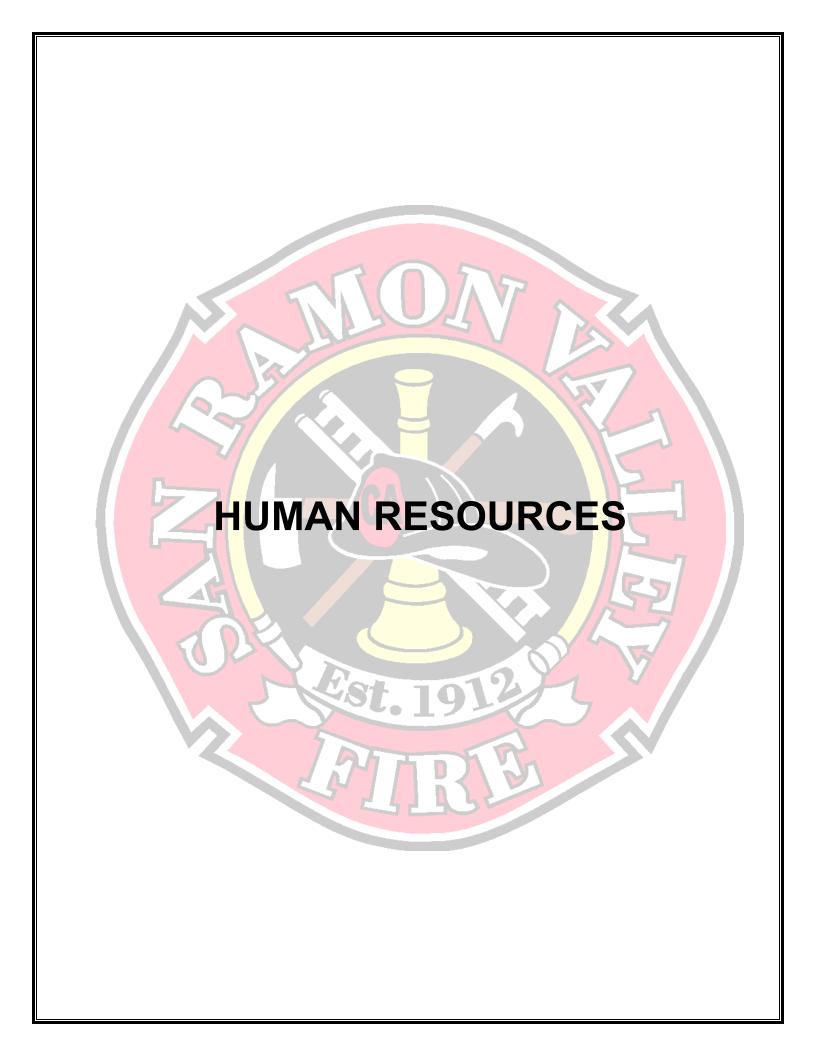


Figure 8: CAD Hardware Project Plan

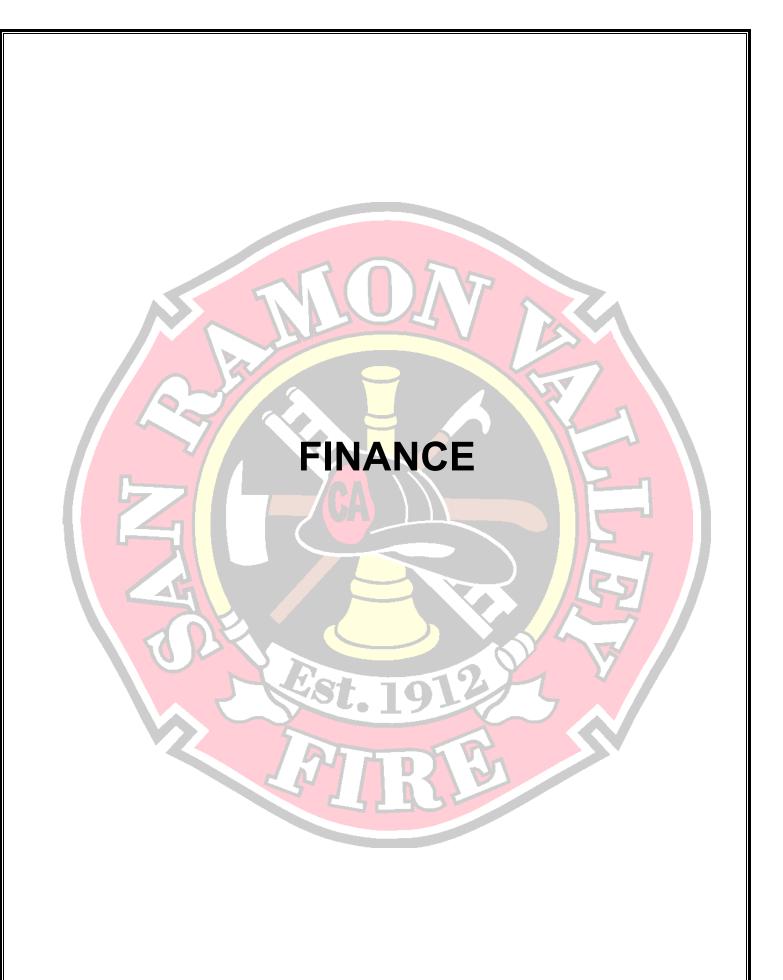
