4. *Use Tax Accrual = District remits Use Tax directly to State of CA based on Use-Tax Share Agreement b/w City of San Ramon and the District (Nov. 2014). This local share of tax revenue is allocated to jurisdiction of "first use". In exchange for District's responsibility to collect and remit this tax, the City shares the added use tax revenue on a 50/50 basis with the District. Otherwise Out of State purchases are pooled on a County-wide basis. With this arrangement, the City receives the full local share.

- Proposed budget presented for 2017/18. See attached budget. The expected expenses for 17/18 are flat and mirror two key facts: the fair will be held in 2018. Some funds shift to help prepare for the fair and start marketing. Otherwise funds are set for review of the current programs as presented last meeting, and determine other projects necessary to support the activities.

- 5. Committee Reports and Policy Updates
 - Alert, Notification and Communications Report:
 - o **Denton Carlson** presented the following.
 - We have upgraded the Nixle capabilities (for San Ramon) to include mass landline calling in the event of a need for citywide emergency notifications. Danville and unincorporated area are still under the County TENS (Telephone Emergency Notification System) for landline notifications.
 - Work continues on the upgrade to the am 1610 broadcast system. The broadcast tower will be moved to the roof of the San Ramon City Hall to allow for better coverage/broadcasting. In this location it will also be linked to the diesel generator as an emergency power source.
 - Training, Education and Publications Committee Report
 - Jeff Hebel presented the following.
 - The next fair will take place on September 29, 2018. Theme to be Haywired.
 - Preliminary discussions have been started. We are looking at partnering with Sunset
 Development and the new city center complex for joint marketing opportunities.
 - We will continue to focus on a family friendly event with games for kids/families
 - We discussed the idea of allowing vendors to sell emergency prep kits and related items at the Fair. PAC is supportive of the concept as long as vendors are selling things that relate to the Fair's overall mission.
 - Joyce Feldman from Farmers has again donated \$1000 to be a Sponsor for the Fair.
 - Earthquake Geologist Emeritus David Schwartz will be presenting at this year's fair and talking about the Haywired.
 - Giveaway idea for this year's event is Earthquake Putty
 - PAC members brought up a great idea for AT&T to host landline examples and battery powered backups for phone users in an earthquake or emergency. Ken Mintz to follow up on what AT&T can provide.

 - Danielle Bell presented the following CERT updates.
 - 1675 trained CERT volunteers are registered with the SRV EP CCC.
 - Two full CERT Classes #79 and #80 which finishes tomorrow 3/24/18.
 - Blackhawk HOA tabletop Emergency on floods March 15th.
 - CERT Communication Drill April 21st.
 - Hosted Family Radio Service Class for CERT members.
 - Sycamore CERT Container has been filled with supplies donated by Toyota.
 - February CERT Trainers supported Train the Trainer training in San Jose in which the State stayed the entire time to monitor the class and approve State instructors for CERT from San Ramon.
 - Personal Emergency Preparedness Class@ San Ramon Library
 - Personal Emergency Preparedness Class @ Five9 (in person and via webinar)
 - CERT Logo with Mt. Diablo in the back approved. Perhaps taking tall building out (from National Logo), but not necessary.
 - Discussion on charging \$50.00 for out of area CERT participants who want to take the SRV CERT Training. If they live or work here the class will continue to be free of charge.

 - o Danielle Bell & Vanek presented the following.
 - Closed caption for the RCF Evacation training Video is in discussion with the State CAL
 OES, providing funds. Closed caption in three languages would be provided.
 - May 2nd RCF Video training throughout the County led by Gerald Tom from the County.
 - July 10th will be the RCF mini training for our six and under care homes.
 - February presentation for Autism Presentation for Crisis Intervention Team of Contra Costa County. Over 30 PD officers were in attendance.
 - Staff worked with Del Amigo on Emergency Evacuation Protocols for school and brought students to Fire Station to do inclusive training and familiarization.
 - Staff working with Down Syndrome connection in Danville to get prepared and resilient.

- Pac member Mintz brought up the idea of doing Business Continuity planning for the off Fair year project in 2019. In addition, many believe having the Active Shooter Training rolled up into this Business Preparation module would be effective.
