- 5.1 Approve the salaries, payroll taxes and retirement contributions for the month of December 2016 in the amount of \$4,087,198.43.

- 2. Approve Fire Inspector/Investigator and Deputy Fire Marshall will no longer be responsible for standby coverage outside of that employees' regular work schedule and, as a result, will no longer receive the two and one-half percent (2.5%) Standby Pay that was previously rolled into their Base Pay. However, an incentive pay compensation in the amount of two and one-half percent (2.5%) per month of salary shall be provided to incumbent Fire Inspectors/Investigators and Deputy Fire Marshal in recognition of Fire Investigation recall duties as described in the Letter of Understanding dated December 15, 2016.

6. SPECIAL ANNOUNCMENTS/PRESENTATIONS/GENERAL BUSINESS

6.1 Official swearing in of Directors Kerr, Stamey and Stark.

Directors Kerr, Stamey and Stark were sworn in by District Clerk Maxwell.

6.2 Recognition of 2016 Firefighter of the Year, Brian Olson and 2016 Employee of the Year, Debbie Faria.

Chief Meyer introduced Employee of the Year, Debbie Faria and her family. Senior Office Assistant Faria has been with the District for 9-years. With regard to her role in Logistics, she manages to take crisis

situations and find great solutions. She not only contributes to Logistics, she is always willing to go above and beyond with other projects as needed. SOA Faria is the go-to-person for our Suppression personnel. This is her 2nd Employee of the Year award, as she was also recognized in 2011. Deputy Chief Krause also spoke about SOA Faria's dedication and commitment to the Logistics Division.

Chief Meyer introduced Firefighter of the Year, Brian Olson, his Fiancée and her grandparents. Firefighter/ Paramedic Olson began his career with the District in 2007, serving as a Communications Center Volunteer and Volunteer Firefighter. By 2009, he was hired as a District Aide. In 2010, he was hired by San Rafael Fire as a full-time Firefighter; but continued with the District as a volunteer. The following year, the District hired him as a full-time Firefighter/Paramedic. He remains committed to the volunteer reserve program, assisting reserves with their Class B Firefighter endorsements. In 2012, he responded to an incident where a mother of a newborn baby went into cardiac arrest. FF/PM Olson was part of the team that performed CPR on the new mother, with her baby just a few feet away. The mother was revived by the team. FF/PM Olson is known for being committed to his family, coworkers and his patients (treating them like family). He is also known for going above and beyond. Chief Meyer read a quote offered by one of FF/PM Olson's peers, "If you think my praise of Brian is exaggerated in any way, you are wrong. Brian is the best example of what our Organization represents; loyalty, dedication and hard work!"

At 2:24 p.m., President Parker adjourned the Open meeting and Board members went into Closed Session, with Attorney Morin Jacob, at 3:10 p.m. Closed Session adjourned at 3:24 p.m. and Director Parker opened the Regular meeting.

7. OLD BUSINESS

7.1 Update on Fire Station No. 32.

Chief Meyer provided the update on Fire Station 32. Recent change orders will be brought to the Board at next month's meeting, to keep members up to speed with finances. The project remains under budget and on time with a move-in date set for March 2016.

7.2 Consider approving the contract for minor repair and overall painting to Station 39, with A-Plus Painting, for an amount not to exceed \$16,350. The funds are available for this purchase in the Capital Improvement Plan and have been budgeted for FY 2016/17.

7.3 Authorize staff to purchase six (6) Zoll AutoPulse Cardiac Support Units, in an amount not to exceed \$75,000.00. This is a budgeted expense for FY 2016/17.

Board report prepared by Battalion Chief John Duggan. Motion by Director Stark to authorize the purchase of six (6) Zoll AutoPulse Cardiac Support Units, in an amount not to exceed \$75,000.00. This is a budgeted expense for FY 2016/17. Motion seconded by Director Stamey. Motion carried with (5) ayes and (0) noes.

7.4 Discussion and approval of the Letter of Understanding between the SRVFPD and IAFF Local 3546, with regard to 5% salary adjustment, for all Dispatch employees, as approved on January 27, 2016; effective December 1, 2016. This is a budgeted expense for FY 2016-17.

Chief Meyer and Director of Emergency Communications Pangelinan provided this update. Per a Letter of Understanding, approved by the Board on January 27, 2016, Dispatch employees are slated to receive a 5% salary adjustment, effective December 1, 2016, should the Communications Center meet all performance standards. Since going live June 1, 2016 all 911 calls, including wireless carriers have been cutover for the City of San Ramon. There has been an increase in 911 calls, from 500 to 1300 per month. All Emergency Medical Dispatching (EMD) accreditation requirements continue to be maintained at an exception level. Incoming 911 calls are being answered within 10 seconds, 95% of the time and within 15 seconds, 99% of the time; which exceeds the national average of 15 seconds. Call processing times are within the appropriate and expected range. The Communications Center went live a month earlier than anticipated, which is why staff is asking the Board to approve the 5% increase at this Board meeting, instead of the January 2017 Board meeting. Chief Meyer and Director Stamey congratulated DEC Pangelinan for a good job. Director Stamey reported that he is very appreciative of the positive responses he has heard from members of the San Ramon Police Department. A motion was made by Director Campbell to approve a 5% wage adjustment to Dispatch employees, effective December 1, 2016 and seconded by Director Stark. Motion carried with (5) ayes and (0) noes.

7.5 Consideration of an amended Letter of Understanding (LOU) between the SRVFPD and IAFF Local 3546, with regard to the reorganization of the Fire Prevention Division and authorize the Fire Chief to sign the LOU.

Human Resources Director Natalie Korthamar Wong provided this update. The amended Letter of Understanding (LOU) confirms the understandings that have been reached between the District and the International Association of Firefighters, Local 3546. The key changes from the February 23, 2016 LOU include: Amends the name of the Fire Prevention Division to the Fire and Life Safety Division; effective upon Board approval. Renames the following new classifications [Fire and Life Safety Manager and Fire and Life Safety Inspector] which were approved with the prior February 23, 2016 LOU (with salaries pending further negotiation). Establishes that the two existing Fire Inspector positions, currently classified as "safety" for pension purposes, will remain available as promotional opportunities for current employees. Adjusts the base salary of the Code Compliance Officers and Fire Prevention Specialists by 2.5%, effective the first day of the month following approval of this LOU by the Board of Directors. States the salary ranges for newly hired Fire and Life Safety Inspector and Permit Technician classifications. The proposed salary is within the market for comparable positions in the surrounding area and is commensurate with the duties and responsibilities associated with the Fire and Life Safety Inspector and Permit Technician. Provides that the Fire and Life Safety Manager may, in the District's sole discretion, perform all duties and responsibilities of the Fire and Life Safety Inspector, Permit Technician and all former classifications, as needed. Provides that in order the ensure that the services provided by the Fire and Life Safety Division are responsive to the needs of customers, the District, in its sole discretion, may employ temporary employees or use the services of a qualified contractor. Motion by Director Stamey to approve the Letter of Understanding between the San Ramon Valley Fire Protection District and IAFF Local 3546, dated December 15, 2016 and to authorize the Fire Chief to sign the LOU. Motion seconded by Director Campbell. Motion carried with (5) ayes and (0) noes.

8. NEW BUSINESS

8.1 Nixle presentation, Roy Wendel Acting Fire Prevention Manager.

Nixle allows government agencies to send notifications to local residents, via phone, email and/or the Internet. Information is delivered almost instantly. The annual fee for this service is \$19,000. The District, City of San Ramon, Town of Danville and the San Ramon Valley Citizen Corps Council would share this resource and contribute to the expense. The benefits of the Nixle service would include: Each entity would have its own System Administrator. Allows for local control over policies and procedures. Delivers mass notifications to multiple jurisdictions, with an option to customize internal communication lists. Nixle could also assist with special events and social media communications. Staff will continue to look into Nixle, with regard to how the system would be used with the San Ramon Police Department and the Emergency Communications Center.

10. MONTHLY ACTIVITY REPORTS

10.1 Operations Division-Deputy Chief, Lon Phares Operations Report of monthly activities

[On December 2, 2016 a fire broke out in a warehouse, known as the Ghost Ship. The Ghost Ship had been converted into residential and entertainment use, without permits. A total of 36 people were killed in the fire; the deadliest in the history of Oakland, California]. Along with representatives from other public safety agencies, Battalion Chief McNamara assisted the Oakland Fire Department, serving as an Incident Safety Officer, for two days. The cause of the Ghost Ship fire in under investigation. On December 4, 2016 District crews responded to the report of a fire at a two-story condominium. Firefighters forced entry into the building and discovered the fire on the second floor. Preliminary investigations show that the fire was caused by a marijuana grow operation. There were no injuries; but children were sleeping next-door. Firefighter Paramedic recruits, finishing up the Academy (2016-2) are scheduled to be introduced at the next Board meeting.

10.2 EMS – Battalion Chief, John Duggan EMS Report of monthly activities.

The District responded to approximately 623 emergency medical incidents, since the November 16^{th} Board of Directors meeting. Nine of these incidents were in response to cardiac arrest patients. Four of these patients were found to have expired, prior to the arrival of District responders and one patient was transported to the San Ramon Regional Medical Center, where the patient later passed in the emergency room. Three patients were treated in the field and transported to an Intensive Care Unit, with a return of spontaneous circulation. This month's period showed an overall survival rate of 44%; which is well above the national standard.

10.3 Logistics – Deputy Chief, Derek Krause Logistics Report of monthly activities.

Staff initiated comprehensive Facility Maintenance and Repair Inspections utilizing Emergency Construction Services. All stations to be inspected to develop a comprehensive assessment of the health of the facilities, ensure sustainability and preempt the service calls and repairs that interrupt operations. Staff also conducted preventative maintenance and repairs on the District fleet to effectively manage costs and maintain safely.

10.4 Fire Prevention – Division Chief - Fire Marshal, Christina Kiefer Fire Prevention Report of monthly activities.

Annual Fire and Life Safety Inspections continue in accordance to the priorities established in the June 2016, Fire Prevention report to the Board. State Mandated Annual Inspections have been completed. Staff is working toward completing inspections of Residential Care Facilities. Businesses with Fire Code Operational Permits and other occupancies; generally, business and mercantile, will follow. In November, the California Highway Patrol's Start Smart program was held at California High School. The Street Smarts "Story Book" contestant winners will attend an award ceremony on January 25, 2017.

At this time, Director Kerr asked if the Board meeting, previously scheduled for 2:00 p.m. on January 25, 2017, could be moved up to 1:00 p.m., to allow Board members to attend the Street Smarts Awards Ceremony. The Directors concurred and the January 25, 2017 Regular Board meeting was moved up to 1:00 p.m.

The Steering Committee for the update of the Contra Costa Local Hazard Mitigation Plan convened on November 10th to begin establishing the objectives of the work group. Thirty-six partner agencies are participating, with the second meeting scheduled for today, December 15, 2016.

10.5 Communications Division – Director of Emergency Communications, Denise Pangelinan Communications Report of monthly activities.

Interviews to fill the Public Safety Dispatcher vacancy have been completed. Staff conducted a 911 presentation and tour for the San Ramon Citizen Academy. Technology staff installed security updates on all SRV911 CAD and interface servers. Abila find accounting software version 2017.1 was upgraded, as was the backup software on the SRV911 CAD and interface servers. Communications Reserves trained with District Aides on Breathing Support Operation. Dispatchers, along with San Ramon Police, attended Command and Control Training. On December 10, 2016, DEC Pangelinan volunteered with the Cops Care Cancer Foundation, where approximately 150 children, stricken with Cancer, (and their families), were treated to a fun filled version of the North Pole. Santa arrives by helicopter to great the kids with gifts that have been tailored to their requests. 10.6 Human Resources Division – Human Resources Director Natalie Korthamar Wong Human Resources Report of monthly activities.

HR Director Korthamar Wong shared a benefits update video which covered dental and EAP benefits for the new year. Dental and EAP providers to SRVFPD employees have been changed to provide greater benefits to employees at a lower cost. The District's Dental plan provider is now Sun Life: employees can keep their current dentist; the annual maximum benefit increased from \$2,000 to \$3,000; dental implants are included in the plan; dependent eligibility went up to age 26; and the rate is guaranteed for 2-years. With regard to District EAP benefits, the new provider is Concern EAP: a local EAP provider and the District will be saving \$82.80 per year, an annual reduction of 0.27%. The District will keep VSP for vision services at a 3% rate increase and The Hartford for Life and AD&D, with a 0% increase in rate. Total benefit savings for the 1st year will be \$74,265.48. HR Director Korthamar Wong introduced Alan Wang, President of UBF Consulting, to the Board. Mr. Wang assisted the District by comparing current benefit plans to other vendors, in the local market place.

10.7 Finance Division – Financial Consultant, Ken Campo and Controller, Martin Koran Monthly Finance Report of monthly activities.

FC Campo reported that staff assisted the NBS Government Finance Group with the update of the District's Cost Allocation Plan and submittal of Ground Emergency Medical Transport costs reports for additional Medicare reimbursement of \$65,423. CCERA has released the 2017/18 retirement rates and said they are holding steady. Finance and HR staff viewed an electronic document management system presentation and are working closely together to promote greater transparency, efficiency and security of District documents.

Controller Koran provided the overview of the monthly Financial Report; dated November 30, 2016. General Fund reserves for the 2016/17 Fiscal Year are at \$30,908,368, which is higher than budgeted and above Board policy. Cash Balances of all funds combined illustrate that in Fiscal Year 2016/17, the District is better off by \$700,000 in comparison to this time last year. Salaries and Benefits are at \$24,068,799, which is in line with budget expectations. General Fund Expenditures for 2016/17 are right on target, in comparison to FY2015/16, and currently at \$26,309,770. Current Ambulance revenue fees are better than this time last year. November 2016 saw \$306,000 in revenues, which was \$32,000 ahead of monthly expectations. Transports are also up, in comparison to last year. General Fund revenues are currently at \$3,903,170 and in line with the budget and prior year. The District will receive the first property tax payment on December 16, 2016 and are expecting to come in approximately \$1 million above budget expectations for the FY2016/17.

10.8 Fire Chief – Fire Chief, Paige Meyer Verbal report on monthly meetings, seminars, committee meetings, and other District related activities.

Chief Meyer and Director Stark recently attended a retiree luncheon, where retirees told the Chief that they appreciate the direction the District heading. Chief Meyer also spoke about attending the

Ongoing Hydrant Replacement

Background:

Several years ago the District initiated a program to replace all standard 2.5 inch fire hydrants in the District with a model 64 steamer hydrant containing a 4.5 inch outlet connection in order to optimize available flow. We are aware of 66 standard 2.5 inch hydrants that currently remain scattered throughout the District. The 2016/2017 Operations Budget includes appropriations to replace half (33) of these remaining hydrants with the model 64 steamer hydrant. The cost for replacement is \$1,518 per fire hydrant, for a total expected cost of around \$50,100. The remaining (33) 2.5 inch fire hydrants are planned for replacement next fiscal year.

The fire hydrants chosen for replacement in 2016/2017 were selected based on priority due to their proximity to residential care facilities, schools and churches. Staff also contacted East Bay Municipal Utility District (EBMUD) to ensure the selected hydrants would generate optimum benefit by considering such factors as available pressure, pipe sizes, elevation and/or distance from source. EBMUD has confirmed all of these hydrants are fed by a minimum of a 6" lateral and would benefit from replacement.

Recommended Board Action:

Authorize staff to replace up to 33 standard 2.5 inch fire hydrants with a model 64 steamer hydrant with a 4.5 inch outlet connection.

Fiscal Impact:

None. The 2016/2017 Operations Budget contains \$53,625 for this program, which is sufficient to cover this year's anticipated replacement cost.

Self-Insurance Assessment for Fiscal Year 2016-2017

Background

The District is self-insured for workers' compensation insurance. As a self-insured employer, the District is regulated by the State of California, Department of Industrial Relations, Office of Self-Insurance Plans. Labor Code Sections 62.5 and 62.6 authorize the Department of Industrial Relations to assess employers for the costs of the administration of the workers' compensation program. The assessment is based upon the total indemnity costs actually paid by the District in FY 2016-2017. The current assessment amount is \$36,187.83, which is up \$4,987.83 (or 16%) from the previous year.

Recommended Board Action:

Authorize payment to the State of California for the Workers' Compensation Insurance Self-Insurance Assessment for Fiscal Year 2016-2017 in the amount of \$36,187.83.

Background

Pursuant to Section 5.3 of the District's Investment Policy, staff is required to present a quarterly report of investments to the Board of Directors. The investment report for the quarter ended December 31, 2016, is attached. The investments held on behalf of the District are in compliance with the District's investment policy. Overall investment earnings for the first quarter of Fiscal Year 2016/17 are \$134,043 at an average weighted yield-to-maturity of 0.9%.

In December 2014, the District began investing Budget Stabilization Funds into a short-term laddered portfolio at Bank of the West maturing at intervals from 6 months to 5 years. As of December 2016, the District has approximately \$17.6 million of Budget Stabilization Funds under active management, including \$2 million in a 6-month certificate of deposit with Tri-Valley Bank. These funds have earned \$71,917 fiscal year-to-date, which represents an average weighted yield to maturity of 1.65%.

As of December 31, 2016, the remaining \$1.1 million balance of debt proceeds (Station 32 Project Fund) is invested in a money market account at U.S. Bank in order to provide liquidity for the final phase of the Station 32 project. Prior to this, the funds were invested in a short-term laddered portfolio maturing at intervals from 60-270 days. As investments matured, they were reinvested in order to achieve the highest yield possible while retaining safety and liquidity. These funds earned \$1,522 fiscal year-to-date through December 31, 2016, at an average weighted yield-to-maturity of 0.10%.

Also attached is the quarterly statement for the District's California Employers' Retiree Benefit Trust account (or "OPEB" trust fund) for the quarter ended December 31, 2016. As of December 31, 2016, the balance is \$13,432,842. In addition to the \$1.5 million of contributions, the December 31, 2016 balance includes fiscal year-to-date investment earnings of \$313,000, which

represents an annualized yield of 5%. The purpose of this trust fund is to set-aside funds to pay for health care benefits for retired employees. These investments are in a pooled fund managed by CalPERS. During Fiscal Year 2016/17, the District has budgeted to contribute \$3,355,892 in order to meet the Annual Required Contribution.

Recommendation

Staff recommends that the Board receive and review the investment report for the quarter ended December 31, 2016, and receive and review the California Employers' Retiree Benefit Trust Statement for the quarter ended December 31, 2016.



Sande Roberts and Wende Wylie, The Sisters

Background:

In June 2016, the District retained consultants Sande Roberts and Wende Wylie (also known as The Sisters) to provide communication and team building training to the Fire and Life Safety Division employees, District managers working in and with the Division, and Union leaders working with the Division. The Sisters have extensive knowledge and experience working with fire departments and have provided similar trainings to other fire agencies that were implementing a reorganization. The original plan was to have them provide one session of training on communication skills and team building in June 2016. A few months following that first session we found it would be beneficial to provide additional training to the employees, managers and Union leaders working in and interacting with the Fire and Life Safety Division. As such, the Sisters held 4 additional training sessions.

Upon learning more about the training content, we found that a similar training would be beneficial for the Emergency Communications Division due to the recent consolidation of the Dispatch center, the addition of new employees and recent promotions. The Emergency Communications Division had two training sessions with The Sisters. If there is a need, we will consider bringing The Sisters back for additional sessions with the Fire and Life Safety Division and Emergency Communications.

Financial Impacts:

The total cost for FY 2016/17 will not to exceed \$50,000. There are FY 2016/17 budget savings for these services in Human Resources, Emergency Communications and Fire Chief budgets, therefore no additional appropriations are necessary.

Recommended Board Action:

Consider approving an amendment to the contract for professional services with The Sisters, for an amount not to exceed \$50,000.

The District's Finance Division has prepared the financial statements for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2016, and those statements have been audited by Vavrinek, Trine, Day & Company, LLP (VTD). In addition to the financial statement audit, VTD was engaged to prepare a required report on the District's GANN spending limit calculation, along with several reports to the Board required by professional accounting standards discussing their audit engagement and the procedures they performed. These reports have been reviewed by management and any recommendations have been implemented.

Based upon the audit procedures performed, VTD has rendered their opinion that the financial statements fairly present the District's financial position at June 30, 2016, and the results of its operations and budgetary comparison for the year then ended, in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles. (This is generally referred to as a "clean" or "unmodified" audit opinion.)

The District incorporates its basic financial statements into a Comprehensive Annual Financial Report (or CAFR) that is designed to meet the requirements of the Government Finance Officers Association (GFOA) Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting Program (CAFR Program). The CAFR Program was established to encourage and assist state and local governments in going beyond the minimum requirements of generally accepted accounting principles, and to prepare a comprehensive annual financial report that evidences the spirit of transparency and full disclosure. The GFOA then recognizes individual governments that succeed in achieving this goal. The District began its participation in the CAFR Program in 2001 and has achieved certification each year thereafter.

The District's CAFR for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2016 has been submitted to the GFOA for consideration of a Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting, and has been posted on the District's website. The Board and other interested parties are encouraged to read the Management's Discussion and Analysis (MD&A) section of the CAFR for an understanding of the significant financial transactions and initiatives impacting the financial position of the District at June 30, 2016, and the results of operations for the year then ended.

Recommended Action

No action required. Staff recommends the Board receive the CAFR, Required Communications, and report on Agreed Upon Procedures Applied to Appropriations Limit Schedule for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2016.

We have audited the financial statements of the San Ramon Valley Fire Protection District (the District) for the years ended June 30, 2016. Professional standards require that we provide you with information about our responsibilities under generally accepted auditing standards and *Government Auditing Standards*, as well as certain information related to the planned scope and timing of our audit. We have communicated such information in our engagement letter. Professional standards also require that we communicate to you the following information related to our audit.

Significant Audit Findings

Qualitative Aspects of Accounting Practices

Management is responsible for the selection and use of appropriate accounting policies. The significant accounting policies used by San Ramon Valley Fire Protection District are described in Note 1 to the financial statements. As further described in Footnote 1, the District adopted Governmental Accounting Standards Board (GASB) Statement No. 72, Fair Value Measurement and Application, and GASB Statement No. 82, Pension Issues-An amendment of GASB Statements No. 67, No. 68, and No.73, effective July 1, 2016. No other accounting policies were adopted and the application of existing policies was not changed during 2016. We noted no transactions entered into by San Ramon Valley Fire Protection District during the year for which there is a lack of authoritative guidance or consensus. All significant transactions have been recognized in the financial statements in the proper period.

Accounting estimates are an integral part of the financial statements prepared by management and are based on management's knowledge and experience about past and current events and assumptions about future events. Certain accounting estimates and disclosures are particularly sensitive because of their significance to the financial statements and because of the possibility that future events affecting them may differ significantly from those expected. The most sensitive estimates and disclosures affecting the District's financial statements were related to the net pension liability, related deferred inflows of resources and deferred outflows of resources, and Other Post Employment Benefits, based on actuarial valuations. We evaluated the key factors and assumptions used to develop these estimates in determining they are reasonable in relation to the financial statements taken as a whole.

The financial statement disclosures are neutral, consistent, and clear.

Difficulties Encountered in Performing the Audit

We encountered no significant difficulties in dealing with management in performing and completing our audit.

Disagreements with Management

For purposes of this letter, professional standards define a disagreement with management as a financial accounting, reporting, or auditing matter, whether or not resolved to our satisfaction, that could be significant to the financial statements or the auditor's report. We are pleased to report that no such disagreements arose during the course of our audit.

Management Representations

We have requested certain representations from management that are included in the management representation letter dated December 13, 2016.

Management Consultations with Other Independent Accountants

In some cases, management may decide to consult with other accountants about auditing and accounting matters, similar to obtaining a "second opinion" on certain situations. If a consultation involves application of an accounting principle to the San Ramon Valley Fire Protection District's financial statements or a determination of the type of auditor's opinion that may be expressed on those statements, our professional standards require the consulting accountant to check with us to determine that the consultant has all the relevant facts. To our knowledge, there were no such consultations with other accountants.

Other Audit Findings or Issues

We generally discuss a variety of matters, including the application of accounting principles and auditing standards, with management each year prior to retention as San Ramon Valley Fire Protection District's auditors. However, these discussions occurred in the normal course of our professional relationship and our responses were not a condition to our retention.

Other Matters

We applied certain limited procedures to the Management's Discussion and Analysis, the Schedule of Proportionate Share of the Net Pension Liability, the Schedule of Plan Contributions, and Schedule of Funding Progress for the Retiree Health Benefit Plan, which are required supplementary information (RSI) that supplements the basic financial statements. Our procedures consisted of inquiries of management regarding the methods of preparing the information and comparing the information for consistency with management's responses to our inquiries, the basic financial statements, and other knowledge we obtained during our audit of the basic financial statements. We did not audit the RSI and do not express an opinion or provide any assurance on the RSI.

We were engaged to report on the supplementary information which accompany the financial statements but are not RSI. With respect to this supplementary information we made certain inquiries of management and evaluated the form, content, and methods of preparing the information to determine that the information complies with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, the method of preparing it has not changed from the prior period, and the information is appropriate and complete in relation to our audit of the financial statements. We compared and reconciled the supplementary information to the underlying accounting records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves.

Restriction on Use

This information is intended solely for the use of the Board of Directors and management of San Ramon Valley Fire Protection District and is not intended to be and should not be used by anyone other than these specified parties.

Our report included an emphasis of matter paragraph regarding the Town's adoption of Governmental Accounting Standards Board (GASB) Statement No. 72, Fair Value Measurement and Application, and GASB Statement No. 82, Pension Issues-An amendment of GASB Statements No. 67, No. 68, and No.73, as of July 1, 2015. Our opinion is not modified with respect to these matters.

Internal Control Over Financial Reporting

In planning and performing our audit of the financial statements, we considered San Ramon Valley Fire Protection District's internal control over financial reporting (internal control) to determine the audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances for the purpose of expressing our opinions on the financial statements, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of San Ramon Valley Fire Protection District's internal control. Accordingly, we do not express an opinion on the effectiveness of San Ramon Valley Fire Protection District's internal control.

A deficiency in internal control exists when the design or operation of a control does not allow management or employees, in the normal course of performing their assigned functions, to prevent, or detect and correct, misstatements on a timely basis. A material weakness is a deficiency, or a combination of deficiencies, in internal control, such that there is a reasonable possibility that a material misstatement of the entity's financial statements will not be prevented, or detected and corrected on a timely basis. A significant deficiency is a deficiency, or a combination of deficiencies, in internal control that is less severe than a material weakness, yet important enough to merit attention by those charged with governance.

Our consideration of internal control was for the limited purpose described in the first paragraph of this section and was not designed to identify all deficiencies in internal control that might be material weaknesses or, significant deficiencies. Given these limitations, during our audit we did not identify any deficiencies in internal control that we consider to be material weaknesses. However, material weaknesses may exist that have not been identified.

Compliance and Other Matters

As part of obtaining reasonable assurance about whether San Ramon Valley Fire Protection District's financial statements are free from material misstatement, we performed tests of its compliance with certain provisions of laws, regulations, contracts, and grant agreements, noncompliance with which could have a direct and material effect on the determination of financial statement amounts. However, providing an opinion on compliance with those provisions was not an objective of our audit, and accordingly, we do not express such an opinion.

The results of our tests disclosed no instances of noncompliance or other matters that are required to be reported under Government Auditing Standards.

Purpose of this Report

The purpose of this report is solely to describe the scope of our testing of internal control and compliance and the results of that testing, and not to provide an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control or on compliance. This report is an integral part of an audit performed in accordance with *Government Auditing Standards* in considering the entity's internal control and compliance. Accordingly, this communication is not suitable for any other purpose.

The procedures performed and our findings were as follows:

1. We obtained completed worksheets No. 1 through No. 7 (or alternatives worksheets) for the year ending June 30, 2016, and compared the limit and annual adjustment factors included in those worksheets to the limit and annual adjustment factors that were adopted by resolution of the Board of Directors. We also compared the population and inflation options included in the aforementioned worksheets to those that were selected by a recorded vote of the Board of Directors.

Finding: No exceptions were noted as a result of our procedures.

Finding: No exceptions were noted as a result of our procedures.

We were not engaged to, and did not perform an audit, the objective of which would be the expression of an opinion on the Appropriations Limit worksheet. Accordingly, we do not express such an opinion. Had we performed additional procedures, other matters might have come to our attention that would have been reported to you. No procedures have been performed with respect to the determination of the appropriation limit for the base year, as defined by Article XIII-B of the California Constitution.

NOTES TO THE APPROPRIATIONS LIMIT SCHEDULE FOR THE YEAR ENDED JUNE 30, 2016

1. PURPOSE OF LIMITED PROCEDURES REVIEW

Under Article XIII-B of the California Constitution (the Gann Spending Limitations Initiative), California governmental agencies are restricted as to the amount of annual appropriations from proceeds of taxes. Effective for years beginning on or after July 1, 1990, under Section 1.5 of Article XIII-B, the annual calculation of the appropriation limit is subject to a limited procedures review in connection with the annual audit.

2. METHOD OF CALCULATION

Under Section 10.5 of Article XIII-B, for fiscal years beginning on or after July, 1990, the appropriations limit is required to be calculated based on the limit for the fiscal year 1986-87, adjusted for the inflation and population factors discussed in Notes 3 and 4 below.

3. INFLATION FACTORS

A California governmental agency may adjust its appropriations limit by either the annual percentage change in the 4th quarter per capita personal income (which percentage is supplied by the State Department of Finance) or the percentage change in the local assessment roll from the preceding year due to the change of local nonresidential construction. The factor adopted by the District for the year 2016 represents the annual percentage change per capita personal income.

4. POPULATION FACTORS

A California governmental agency may adjust its appropriations limit by either the annual percentage change of the jurisdiction's own population or the annual percentage change in population of the county where the jurisdiction is located. The factor adopted by the District for the year 2016 represents the annual percentage change in population for the County.

5. OTHER ADJUSTMENTS

A California government agency may be required to adjust its appropriations limit when certain events occur, such as the transfer of responsibility for municipal services to, or from, another government agency or private entity. The District had no such adjustment for the year ended June 30, 2016.

Summary:

At the December 2016 Personnel Committee meeting, we discussed the structure and staffing of the Human Resources Division. The Human Resources Division will soon have one Senior Office Assistant position vacancy due to a retirement. We would like request authorization to reclassify the Senior Office Assistant position to a Human Resources Generalist position.

Discussion:

The Human Resources Division is comprised of three budgeted positions: (1) Human Resources Director; (1) HR Generalist; and (1) Senior Office Assistant. The Human Resources Generalist focuses on recruitment and workers' compensation matters while the Senior Office Assistant focuses on benefits administration, updating and maintaining employee records and providing administrative support for the Division. Due to the increased complexity of benefits administration and the need for a candidate with strong skills in human resources systems, we would like to recruit for an HR Generalist position. We have initiated a recruitment and have noted that the position is pending Board of Directors approval.

Financial Impacts:

The estimated total compensation difference between the Senior Office Assistant and the Human Resources Generalist position is \$23,185. There are savings in the Human Resources budget to cover this additional cost, therefore no additional appropriations are necessary. The ongoing additional cost is expected to be approximately \$23,185 annually.

Recommended Board Action:

Authorize reclassification of a Senior Office Assistant position to a Human Resources Generalist position.

District Website and Intranet Upgrade

Background

In FY 09/10, the District partnered with Civica Software to design an innovative and feature-rich website to deliver content to the public via the firedepartment.org website and District employees via an intranet site. The two sites were hosted by Civica and provide a Content Management System (CMS) that allows District staff from all divisions to update the content as needed. Granicus, a leader government content management, recently purchased Civica Software and will apply its expertise to support future development of the District's content.

The District currently uses version 11 of the Granicus CMS, which Granicus is no longer able to support. Version 15, the current software version offered by Granicus, represents a major rewrite of the software and has seamless functionality across any type of device, most notably tablets and smartphones. The new software significantly improves navigation, security, search capabilities utilizing a Google algorithm, as well as social media integration. The CMS has been rewritten to simplify the task of adding or editing existing site content and includes the ability to simultaneously post to both firedepartment.org and Facebook or Twitter.

Granicus presented a cost proposal for an updated and upgraded, fully responsive website, intranet and CMS. The proposal includes a comprehensive review of the existing sites, a design analysis to achieve the appropriate look and feel, improvements to the information architecture to support easy navigation, the implementation of the latest modules and tools, training, quality assurance, and content migration. In order to proceed with the upgrade from version 11 to version 15, staff requests authorization to enter into a contract with Granicus in an amount not to exceed \$25,000.

Recommendation

Authorize staff to enter into a contract with Granicus in an amount not to exceed \$25,000 to upgrade the District's public and intranet websites.

Purchase of Physio-Control LP-15 Monitor/Defibrillators

Background

In order to equip all of the District's Advanced Life Support (ALS) fire apparatus and ambulances with an ALS compatible monitor/defibrillator, the District maintains an inventory of forty-four (44) of these units. The bulk of which are Zoll Monitor/Defibrillators, that were purchased by the District in 2002, with a projected service life of seven (7) years. As these Zoll Monitor/Defibrillators approached their tenth year of service, the frequency and severity of equipment failures in the field began to increase.

In 2012 District Staff were successful in acquiring twenty-one (21) new Physio-Control LP-15 Monitor/Defibrillators via a Contra Costa County regional grant, with an estimated value of approximately \$800.000. Of the various EMS apparatus and equipment currently deployed by the District in support of the delivery of ALS service, the Physio-Control LP-15 Monitor/Defibrillator is the most technologically advanced. These 21 LP-15 units replaced an identical number of Zoll Monitor/Defibrillators, leaving twenty-three (23) of the older Zoll units in service. Recognizing the need to replace these 23 Zoll units that are now eight (8) years beyond their projected seven (7) year service life, the District budgeted Capital Project Funds in both FY 2016/2017 and 2017/2018 for this purpose.

Although the Physio-Control Corporation is the sole provider of the LP-15 Monitor/Defibrillator, staff was successful in negotiating an appreciable price reduction with this vendor for the purchase of twelve units, reducing the quoted and budgeted price of \$465,662 to \$425,000. Staff next met with representatives from American Medical Response (AMR) and explored the possibility of purchasing this equipment through a means known as a "Pass-Thru Purchase." Staff was successful in negotiating a Pass-Thru Purchase Agreement with AMR for this purchase, with a final quoted price of \$358,500. These two actions have resulted in the initial quoted purchase price of \$465,662, being reduced by \$107,162, or 23 percent.

Recommendation

Authorize staff to purchase twelve (12) Physio-Control LP-15 Monitor/Defibrillators in an amount not to exceed \$358,500.

Financial Impacts:

Approval of Purchase of Two Horton Ambulances

Background:

Two Horton Ambulances, acquired in 2009, are scheduled for replacement this year. Funding for the replacement was included in the Fiscal Year (FY) 2016/2017 Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) budget. The Apparatus Committee reviewed the need to replace the ambulances and deemed it appropriate to do so at this time due to the following: increasing maintenance and repair costs; diminishing patient comfort, care and effectiveness; safety issues with respect to weight capacity; and the overall wear and diminishing condition of the vehicles.

The previous ambulance specifications were reviewed and modified to achieve the following: a decrease in overall weight; increase in net load capacity; incorporating Stryker Power Load gurney systems for enhanced employee safety and enhance our bariatric patient handling capability; accommodate rapid-deployment Hurst e-Draulic extrication tools; and improve preventative maintenance and repair capability. The new ambulances will be gasoline fueled, instead of the current diesel fueled ambulances, thus creating a significant reduction in weight and cost; and will have a Liquid Spring fluid suspension system to better distribute weight and adjust ride variables as needed.

Staff determined cost savings could be attained by purchasing some equipment separately and including the installation in the ambulance specifications, such as with the radios, hydraulic rescue tools, gurney and load system, and medical vault. The final specifications were distributed and quotes solicited. A purchasing consortium was also explored but was too far out of the District specifications and needs to be considered viable. The table below (Ambulance Quote Comparison), outlines the cost comparisons between vendors. The costs for District purchased equipment is included to provide the Board with the full cost of the ambulances.

Recommended Board Action:

Authorize staff to negotiate a contract with Leader Industries for the purchase and delivery of two (2) Horton ambulances per District specifications, including independent equipment purchases and installation into finished ambulances, for a cost not to exceed \$323,606 per ambulance, for a total of \$647,212.

Fiscal Impact:

The funds are available for this purchase in the Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) FY16/17 annual budget.

Fleet Management Lease and Upfitting of Two Command Vehicles

Background:

In September of 2015 the Board approved a fleet lease program with Enterprise Fleet Management for the scheduled replacement of specific staff vehicles. Last year the District utilized this program for the replacement of Command Staff vehicles: two (2) Ford F-250 XL 4x4 SD Crew Cab trucks for Battalion Chiefs and three (3) for Training Captains.

The Fiscal Year (FY) 2016/17 Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) includes funding for the replacement of two additional Command Staff vehicles for replacement: the EMS Battalion Chief vehicle (scheduled for replacement in FY-2015/2016), and an EMS Captain vehicle (scheduled for replacement in FY-2013/2014). These replacement vehicles would be later model identical versions of the previously leased command vehicles, 2017 Ford F-250 XL 4x4 SD Crew Cab trucks, except for some small modifications to the storage area for specific EMS equipment. The current EMS Battalion Chief and EMS Captain vehicles scheduled for replacement have over 100,000 miles and over 140,000 miles, respectively. These vehicles are routinely driven code-3 to incidents, and repair requests for them are frequent. The proposed staff vehicles will take advantage of advances in fuel mileage savings (due to lighter and stronger material use), technological advancements (e.g. hands-free Bluetooth phone systems), and safety features (e.g. multiple air bags, backup cameras, lane change warning systems, and improved visibility) that are available on the newer vehicles. The upfitting vendor (WATTCO) has agreed to extend the pricing of their previous competitive bid for upfitting costs for these two vehicles.

The vehicles would be added to the Master Equity Lease Agreement with Enterprise. The interest rate for the financing would be 4.97%, plus a monthly management fee of 0.10% of the cost of the vehicle. The recurring costs are fixed on the day the vehicle is delivered and for the term of the lease. The leases will be 60 months, with common buyout or extension options. Annual rental costs would equal \$7,457 per vehicle. Upfitting costs would be \$38,565.69 per vehicle with the capability of moving the equipment to new vehicles each time a new vehicle is leased.

Recommended Board Action:

Authorize the District to amend its' Master Equity Lease Agreement with Enterprise Fleet Management to include the acquisition of the two (2) Command Staff vehicles noted above for an amount not to

exceed \$14,914 per year for the term of the lease, and to contract with WATTCO for the purchase and installation of emergency equipment and radios, for a one-time amount not to exceed \$77,131.38.

Fiscal Impact:

Emergency equipment upfitting costs and new vehicle lease costs are budgeted in the CIP for Fiscal Year 2016/17.

Goal 1

Distribution of Fire Stations for Built-up Urban Areas of Greater than 2,000 People per Square Mile

To treat and transport medical patients and control small fires, the first-due unit should arrive within 7 minutes total response time, 90 percent of the time from the receipt of the call in fire dispatch. Total response time equates to 1 minute dispatch time, 2 minute crew turnout time and 4 minutes travel time spacing for single units.

Goal 2

Distribution of Fire Stations for Suburban Areas of 1,000 to 2,000 People per Square Mile The first-due fire unit should arrive within 8 minutes total response time, 90 percent of the time.

Goal 3

Distribution of Fire Stations for Rural Areas of Less than 1,000 People per Square Mile The first-due fire unit should arrive within 15 minutes total response time, 90 percent of the time.

Goal 4

Effective Response Force (First Alarm) for Urban Areas of Greater than 2,000 People per Square Mile

To confine fires near the room of origin and to treat up to 5 medical patients at once, a multiple-unit response of at least 15 personnel should arrive within 13 minutes total response time from the time of 911 call receipt, 90 percent of the time. This equates to 1 minute dispatch time, 2 minutes crew turnout time and 10 minutes travel time spacing for multiple units. Suburban areas should receive the full first alarm within 14 minutes total response time, 90 percent of the time with the goal to limit the fire spread to the area already involved upon the arrival of the effective response force. For rural areas, this should be 21 minutes, 90 percent of the time. Outcome goals in these areas would be to confine fires to the building of origin and to care for medical patients.

Goal 5

Hazardous Materials Response

Respond to hazardous materials emergencies with enough trained personnel to protect the community from the hazards associated with the release of hazardous and toxic materials. Achieve a total response time consistent with Goal 1, Goal 2 and Goal 3 with the first company capable of operating at the California OSHA First Responder Operations (FRO) level. After size-up and scene evaluation is complete a determination will be made whether to request the on-duty District Hazardous Materials Team and/or other appropriate resources.

Goal 6

Technical Rescue

Respond to technical rescue emergencies with enough trained personnel to facilitate a successful rescue. Achieve a total response time consistent with Goal 1, Goal 2 and Goal 3 with the first company capable of operating at the California Rescue System 1 (RS1) level. After size-up and scene evaluation is complete a determination will be made whether to request the on-duty District Rescue Team and/or other appropriate resources.


To treat medical patients requiring advanced procedures and skills (defined as Charlie, Delta or Echo), a two-unit response consisting of one paramedic-staffed ambulance and one additional paramedic-staffed unit for a response force of at least five personnel should arrive within 6 minutes travel time in urban areas and 7 minutes travel time in suburban areas, 90 percent of the time. For rural areas, excluding Mt. Diablo State Park, personnel should arrive within 18 minutes travel time 90 percent of the time.

• The District responded to approximately 745 emergency medical incidents since the December 15th Board of Directors' Meeting. Ten (10) of these incidents were in response to cardiac arrest patients. Four of these patients were found to have expired prior to our arrival on-scene, and were reported as field deaths. Two (2) patients expired in the emergency room of the receiving hospital after suffering severe traumatic injuries. Three (3) patients were transported to the emergency room after having experienced unwitnessed cardiac arrests and were pronounced deceased by the attending physician. One (1) patient was transported to the emergency room with the return of spontaneous circulation (ROSC) after having experienced a witnessed cardiac arrest.

- Completed the Comprehensive Annual Financial Report for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2016 and submitted the report to the Government Finance Officers Association for consideration of the Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting. (This would be the 16th consecutive year of receiving the award).
- Based on initial property tax payments for FY16/17, the District is expected to receive approximately \$1.5 million more in property tax revenue, principally due to higher property values. 
