7.1 Approval of purchase of twelve (12) Physio-Control LP-15 Monitor/Defibrillators in an amount not to exceed \$365,000.

EMS Battalion Chief Duggan provided and explained the background for this purchase. Motion by Director Stamey to approve the purchase of twelve Physio Control defibrillators in an amount not to exceed \$365,000. Motion seconded by Director Kerr. Motion carried.

#### 8. NEW BUSINESS

8.1 Approval of reclassification of Human Resources Generalist from "Non-Exempt" to "Exempt" including 40 hours of paid administrative leave as part of the compensation package.

Human Resources Director Korthamar Wong stated that currently the HR Generalist is a non-exempt position and is requesting this reclassification stating that staff in this position exercise independent judgement and would not be eligible for overtime if the position is reclassified to exempt. Board President Parker asked if there were any union issues with this reclassification, Ms. Korthamar Wong stated no as this is a non-represented position. Director Stamey asked if Meyers Nave has weighed in on this issue and Ms. Korthamar Wong indicated he had.

Motion by Director Stamey to approve the reclassification of the Human Resources Generalist from non-exempt to exempt and to include 40 hours of paid administrative leave as part of the compensation package. Motion seconded by Director Campbell. Motion carried.

8.2 Approval of Resolution No.2017-11 authorizing the Initiation of Proceedings to Enter into a Financing Lease to Finance Equipment.

Board Minutes: November 15, 2017

Chief Meyer provided the background on this item introducing Nicki Tallman from Brandis Tallman to provide a brief overview and answer any questions the Board might have. Chief Meyer stated that this purchase will have a positive impact on our CIP and allow for flexibility in our fleet. Director Campbell asked if at the end of the lease term the rigs would be ours and Finance Consultant Campo concurred. Ms. Tallman stated that the results of this item would come back to the board. Motion by Director Stamey to approve Resolution No. 2017-11. Motion seconded by Director Yancey. Motion carried by roll call vote.

8.3 Approval of purchase of Ballistic Protective Equipment in an amount not to exceed \$45,000.

Chief Phares provided the background of this item stating that this one of his department goals for 2017/2018 and due to all the recent events in the country the timing is perfect. Chief Phares showed the Board samples of the helmet and vest and commented that there will also be joint training with the police departments. Director Yancey stated that this is a great idea. Board President Parker asked if we have policies developed for this equipment and suggested external velcro markings be used on the vests. Chief Phares concurred. Motion by Director Yancey to approve this purchase in an amount not to exceed \$45,000. Director Stamey seconded the motion. Motion carried.

#### 9. CORRESPONDENCE FOR POSSIBLE BOARD ACTION AND/OR REVIEW

Board members commented on all of the positive correspondence in this month's packet mainly thanking us for helping with the north bay fires. Board President Parker complimented all of our personnel.

#### 10. MONTHLY ACTIVITY REPORTS

10.1 Operations Division-Deputy Chief, Lon Phares Operations Report of monthly activities

Deputy Chief Phares reviewed his board report stating that academy graduation is scheduled for January 19, 2018 at the AT & T building here in San Ramon. Chief Phares also stated this past month i-Quest training has taken place as well as the fourth quarter training module, auto extrication.

10.2 EMS – Battalion Chief, John Duggan EMS Report of monthly activities.

EMS Battalion Chief Duggan reviewed his board report informing the Board that staff responded to approximately 410 incidents this past month with two incidents cardiac arrest related. Lengthy discussion followed by the board and staff regarding the fire danger on the westside of our District, specifically Alamo. Chief Meyer stated that communication is key and that more education is needed to get out to residents regarding points of exit, defensible space and water supply. Chief Phares stated that plans have been discussed relating to the Ready, Set, Go format and that the District does have good fire trail access. Director Kerr stated that residents need to be educated and now is a good time due to all of the recent fires.

10.3 Logistics – Deputy Chief, Derek Krause Logistics Report of monthly activities.

Deputy Chief Krause highlighted his attendance at several conferences and that the punch list of items at new Station 32 is almost complete. The only issue was regarding the concrete floors in the station.

10.4 Fire and Life Safety Division – Deputy Chief, Derek Krause Fire and Life Safety Report of monthly activities.

Deputy Chief Krause provided the Fire and Life Safety Division report stating that our E-plan reviews continue to be positive and all of our state mandated inspections should be complete by the end of the year. Chief Krause also stated two permit technicians have been hired with starting dates in December.

10.5 Communications Division – Director of Emergency Communications, Denise Pangelinan Communications Report of monthly activities.

In Director of Emergency Communications Pangelinan's absence Chief Meyer reported that Director Pangelinan was voted by the San Ramon Chamber of Commerce as Employee of the Year, with a dinner honoring her as well as others in different categories on Thursday, December 7, 2017. Chief Meyer also stated that our reserves were a great help with the recent north bay fires.

10.6 Human Resources Division – Human Resources Director Natalie Korthamar Wong Human Resources Report of monthly activities.

Human Resources Director Korthamar Wong stated that Human Resources has been extremely busy with recruitments and is also focusing on workers compensation. Board President Parker inquired as to whether employees choose their own physician. Director Wong stated that employees can pre-designate their own doctor.

10.7 Finance Division – Financial Consultant, Ken Campo and Controller, Martin Koran Monthly Finance Report of monthly activities.

Financial Consultant Campo stated that there were no October financials in the packet due to the early date of this board meeting, they will be included in the December Board packet along with the CAFR. Financial Consultant Campo stated that he attended a CSDA regional meeting where the topic was reallocation of property taxes. Director Kerr asked how this became a CSDA issue and Consultant Campo stated through the Tax Payer's Association.

Subject: Final Hydrant Replacement Phase

#### **Background:**

Several years ago the District initiated a program to replace all standard 2.5 inch fire hydrants in the District with a model 64 steamer hydrant containing a 4.5 inch outlet connection in order to optimize available flow. We are aware of 28 standard 2.5 inch hydrants that currently remain scattered throughout the District. The 2017/2018 Operations Budget includes appropriations of \$54,965 to replace all remaining fire hydrants with the model 64 steamer hydrant. The cost for replacement is \$1,518 per fire hydrant, for a total cost of \$44,268. By replacing these remaining 28 hydrants we will conclude the 2.5 inch replacement project in the District.

Additionally, staff has contacted East Bay Municipal Utility District (EBMUD) to ensure the selected hydrants would generate optimum benefit by considering such factors as available pressure, pipe sizes, elevation and/or distance from source.

#### **Recommended Board Action:**

Authorize staff to replace 28 standard 2.5 inch fire hydrants with a model 64 steamer hydrant with a cost not to exceed \$44,268.

#### **Fiscal Impact:**

The 2017/2018 Operations Budget contains sufficient funding to cover the replacement cost.

Self-Insurance Assessment for Fiscal Year 2017-2018

#### **Background**

The District is self-insured for workers' compensation insurance. As a self-insured employer, the District is regulated by the State of California, Department of Industrial Relations, Office of Self-Insurance Plans. Labor Code Sections 62.5 and 62.6 authorize the Department of Industrial Relations to assess employers for the cost to administer the workers' compensation program. The assessment is based upon the total indemnity (i.e., paid time off) costs actually paid by the District in FY 2016-2017. The current assessment amount is \$62,783, which is up \$26,595.17 (or 73%) from the previous year.

As we've been discussing, the District experienced a significant increase in the number of long-term, on the job injuries experienced last fiscal year; which led to a significant increase in indemnity costs, backfill overtime costs and relatedly, the assessment from the Department of Industrial Relations.

#### **Financial Impacts:**

The Human Resources Division budgeted \$37,000 for the state assessment. The excess workers' compensation insurance premium for the current year was approximately \$28,000 under budget, which is sufficient to cover the additional \$25,783 for the state assessment.

#### **Recommended Board Action:**

Authorize payment to the State of California for the Workers' Compensation Insurance Self-Insurance Assessment for Fiscal Year 2017-2018 in the amount of \$62,783.

Special Presentation – Sale of District "Hemme" Property

During the Public Comment period at the last public meeting of the San Ramon Valley Fire Protection District ("District") Board of Directors, the issue was raised whether there were potential deficiencies in the public notices given to public agencies for the District's proposed sale of the District "Hemme Property." Whether the District conducted sufficient environmental review of the Hemme Property was also raised.

By way of background, on June 5, 2014, the District and Contra Costa County entered into a Purchase and Sale Agreement for the sale of surplus District real property commonly referred to as the Hemme Property, located at 1193 Danville Boulevard in Alamo, California, and bearing APN 198-132-017.

Pursuant to the California Surplus Land Act (Government Code section 54220 *et seq.*), certain defined public agencies within the District's boundaries are to receive 60-days' notice of the intent to sell the property, in essence giving them a right of first refusal before the property can be sold to the public at large. (See, Government Code Section 54222). Specifically, notice is to be sent to agencies for potential use as either (1) low or moderate-income housing, (2) parks, recreational, or open-space purposes, (3) school facilities, (4) enterprise zone purposes, or (5) infill or transit zone purposes, as defined by statute.

Consistent with this authority, beginning in December 2013 the following agencies were identified as entities that were to receive notice of the District's intent to sell the Hemme Property. These included the following public entities:

- Town of Danville
- City of San Ramon
- San Ramon Valley Unified School District
- East Bay Regional Park District
- Contra Costa Resource Conservation District
- Mt. Diablo Unified School District
- Dublin-San Ramon Services District
- County of Contra Costa

Form letters notifying these entities of the intended sale were prepared, though it has not been confirmed that all of them received the notices. Based on a review of the records, it is known that the Town of Danville, the City of San Ramon, the San Ramon Valley Unified School District,

and the East Bay Regional Park District were sent executed notices. Public Records Requests are being directed to the remaining entities to determine whether they received the notices as well (attached). It is important to note that *even if* any of these entities did not receive notice, it would *not* invalidate the sale. (Government Code section 54230.5).

As for environmental review of the Hemme Property, we have documented that a Phase I Site Assessment has been performed. Research was conducted by Kleinfelder in 2005 and ENGEO in 2014, both of which had not revealed any problems with the property.

Moreover, records of the State Water Resources Control Board do not indicate that there are any pending environmental cleanup issues with the Hemme Property. In fact, these records indicate that, in order to address the matter, the County requested that ENGEO perform a supplemental review of the Property. In a May 1, 2017 Supplemental Characterization Report, ENGEO concludes that there is "no evidence of impact to the Property" due to the presence of a former gas station.

This would appear to confirm our view that an old picture showing a gasoline pump is not evidence of contamination on the site.

#### **Background:**

In 2004, an underground fuel storage tank was removed from the former Station 32 site on Stone Valley Road in Alamo. The District however did not seek a final closure letter from the Regional Water Quality Control Board (RWQCB) as to whether the site was free of any ground contamination because it was deemed not necessary at the time if the station was to remain in operation for the foreseeable future. Now that the station has been decommissioned, the District needs to determine to the extent of any ground contamination and whether any remediation measures are needed. Such determination is a prerequisite to the sale, disposition or other use of the property.

At the June 2017, meeting, the Board authorized staff, following a Request for Proposals, to contract with a hydrogeological firm, ENGEO, to develop a work plan for approval by the local RWQCB. The plan outlined a process to collect samples, prepare a conceptual site model, conduct risk analysis and request a "No Further Action" letter and closure of the underground storage tank (UST) case under the Low Threat Closure policy and criteria. That work was conducted and a closure letter was requested by ENGEO. The RWQCB denied the closure letter based on the fact that soil contamination was detected at the boundaries of the test field. The RWQCB feels that the extent of contamination cannot be determined without further testing and identification of an uncontaminated perimeter. Based on the report from ENGEO and in furtherance of obtaining a closure letter, a revised plan will need to be developed, new meters need to be placed in additional locations, borings conducted, samples taken, additional laboratory analysis conducted and a new closure letter requested. ENGEO has developed a Proposal for Additional Site Characterization at the request of staff for the additional monitoring measures. Staff also received a Request for Change Order for the previous work based on additional time, equipment and materials for the unanticipated thickness of the concrete and the very high clay concentration of the soil requiring additional driller fees, lab fees, permitting fees, sampling time, site visits and professional services. Staff was able to negotiate a reduction in their original request, resulting in the final proposed fee amount before the Board at this time - \$5,088.50 for the change order and \$35,600 for the additional work.

#### **Recommendation Board Action:**

Authorize staff to contract with ENGEO for the services outlined above for an amount not to exceed \$40,689.

#### **Fiscal Impact:**

Funds are currently available in the Capital budget and will be replaced through the sale or lease of the surplus property.

#### **Background:**

At the November 15, 2017 meeting, the Board initiated the lease purchase financing proceedings and authorized Brandis Tallman LLC to distribute RFP's to potential lenders. District staff reviewed the results of the RFP process with Brandis Tallman and selected Bank of America as the lender for the equipment. The ten-year term of the lease provides for semi-annual payments totaling approximately \$613,000 per year, based on an interest rate of 2.33%, with a project fund of \$5.4 million. (Note that the proposals received for this financing were heavily influenced by the proposed changes to the federal tax code. Representatives of Brandis Tallman will be present at the Board meeting to further discuss the proposals and selection of Bank of America.)

Given the long lead time between order and receipt of ambulances and fire engines, there is a need to establish an escrow account for the proceeds of the lease financing. The proceeds will remain in the escrow account, earning interest, until needed for payment on equipment.

A copy the Master Equipment Lease/Purchase Agreement and related documents are on file with the District Clerk and available for inspection upon request.

#### **Recommendation Board Action:**

Staff recommends the Board approve, by roll call vote, Resolution No. 2017-13 Authorizing Execution of a Lease/Purchase Agreement with Bank of America in an amount not to exceed \$5.5 million, and approving related documents and actions.

#### **Fiscal Impact:**

As presented at the November 15, 2017, meeting, the District's 10-year (operating) financial forecast has been updated to reflect the projected annual lease payments, along with increased capital contributions to the updated CIP. (The CIP has been updated to reflect current expectations on the replacement of major apparatus.) Ending balances and reserves in the operating and capital funds remain above Board policy throughout the forecast period.

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE SAN RAMON VALLEY FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION AND DELIVERY OF A MASTER EQUIPMENT LEASE/PURCHASE AGREEMENT AND SEPARATE LEASE SCHEDULES WITH RESPECT TO THE ACQUISITION, PURCHASE, FINANCING AND LEASING OF CERTAIN AMBULANCES AND FIRE ENGINES, AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION AND DELIVERY OF DOCUMENTS REQUIRED IN CONNECTION THEREWITH, AND APPROVING RELATED DOCUMENTS AND ACTIONS

**WHEREAS**, San Ramon Valley Fire Protection District (the "District") is authorized by the laws of the State of California to purchase, acquire and lease personal property for the benefit of the District and to enter into contracts with respect thereto; and

**WHEREAS**, the District desires to purchase, acquire and lease ambulances and fire engines (the "Equipment") constituting personal property necessary for the District to perform essential governmental functions; and

WHEREAS, in order to acquire such Equipment, the District proposes to enter into that certain Master Equipment Lease/Purchase Agreement (the "Agreement") and separate Lease Schedules from time to time as provided in the Agreement with Bank of America, National Association, or an affiliate, as lessor, the form of which has been presented to the Board of Directors of the District (the "Board") at this meeting; and

**WHEREAS**, the Board deems it for the benefit of the District and for the efficient and effective administration thereof to enter into the Agreement and the separate Lease Schedules as provided in the Agreement for the purchase, acquisition and leasing of the Equipment to be therein described on the terms and conditions therein provided;

**NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED** by the Board of Directors of the San Ramon Valley Fire Protection District as follows:

Section 1. Approval of Documents. The form, terms and provisions of the Agreement and the separate Lease Schedules, and any related Escrow Agreement, as provided in the Agreement are hereby approved in substantially the forms presented at this meeting, with such insertions, omissions and changes as shall be approved by the District Fire Chief or designee executing the same, so long as the principal amount of the Agreement does not exceed \$5,500,000, and so long as the interest rate used to calculate the interest component of the Rental Payments payable under the Agreement does not exceed 2.5%. The Fire Chief of the District is hereby authorized and directed to execute, and the District Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to attest and countersign, the Agreement and each Lease Schedule (including such Exhibits) to the respective parties thereto; the execution and delivery of the Agreement and the separate Lease Schedules being conclusive evidence of such approval. The District Fire Chief is hereby authorized, in consultation with legal counsel to the District, to designate

a Lease Schedule as a "tax-exempt obligation" for purposes of Section 265(b)(3)(B) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended.

**Section 2. Other Actions Authorized.** The President, the Fire Chief, the Interim Chief Finance Officer, the District Clerk and all other officers of the District are each authorized and directed in the name and on behalf of the District to take all action necessary or reasonably required by the parties to the Agreement and each Lease Schedule to carry out, give effect to and consummate the transactions contemplated thereby (including the execution and delivery of Acceptance Certificates, Escrow Agreements, disbursement requests, and any tax certificate and agreement, each with respect to separate Lease Schedules, as contemplated in the Agreement) and to take all action necessary in conformity therewith, including, without limitation, the execution and delivery of any closing and other documents required to be delivered in connection with the Agreement and each Lease Schedule.

**Section 3. No General Liability.** Nothing contained in this Resolution, the Agreement, any Lease Schedule nor any other instrument shall be construed with respect to the District as incurring a pecuniary liability or charge upon the general credit of the District, nor shall the breach of any agreement contained in this Resolution, the Agreement, any Lease Schedule or any other instrument or document executed in connection therewith impose any pecuniary liability upon the District or any charge upon its general credit, except to the extent that the Rental Payments payable under each Lease are special limited obligations of the District as provided in such Lease.

**Section 4. Appointment of Authorized District Representatives.** The District Fire Chief or designee are each hereby designated to act as authorized representatives of the District for purposes of the Agreement and each Lease Schedule and related Escrow Agreement until such time as the governing body of the District shall designate any other or different authorized representative for purposes of the Agreement and each Lease Schedule.

**Section 5. Severability.** If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this Resolution shall for any reason be held to be invalid or unenforceable, the invalidity or unenforceability of such section, paragraph, clause or provision shall not affect any of the remaining provisions of this Resolution.

**Section 6. Effective Date**. This Resolution shall take effect from and after the date of its passage and adoption.

Response

#### **Background:**

The San Ramon Valley Fire Protection District participates in the California Fire Service and Rescue Emergency Mutual Aid System. The California Fire Assistance Agreement (CFAA) is the negotiated reimbursement mechanism for local government fire agency responses under the Mutual Aid System. The CFAA provides for reimbursement of overtime and portal to portal to District employees while in the course of their employment and away from their official duty station and assigned to an emergency incident, in support of an emergency incident, or pre-positioned for emergency response. The District is currently reimbursed for overtime and portal to portal costs of safety classifications under Resolution 2015-02 (approved March 25, 2015). The attached updated resolution adds Public Safety Dispatch Supervisors and Public Safety Dispatchers. So far in FY2017/18, the District has requested \$517,000 of reimbursements through the CFAA.

#### **Recommended Board Action:**

Approve the attached resolution authorizing overtime and portal to portal pay for employees.

#### **Financial Impacts:**

Authorizing overtime and portal to portal pay for employees allows the District to continue to be eligible for reimbursement through the CFAA, amounting to a potential average of \$200,000 per year.

# Goal 1

Distribution of Fire Stations for Built-up Urban Areas of Greater than 2,000 People per Square Mile

To treat and transport medical patients and control small fires, the first-due unit should arrive within 7 minutes total response time, 90 percent of the time from the receipt of the call in fire dispatch. Total response time equates to 1 minute dispatch time, 2 minute crew turnout time and 4 minutes travel time spacing for single units.

## Goal 2

Distribution of Fire Stations for Suburban Areas of 1,000 to 2,000 People per Square Mile

The first-due fire unit should arrive within 8 minutes total response time, 90 percent of the time.

## Goal 3

Distribution of Fire Stations for Rural Areas of Less than 1,000 People per Square Mile

The first-due fire unit should arrive within 15 minutes total response time, 90 percent of the time.

### Goal 4

Effective Response Force (First Alarm) for Urban Areas of Greater than 2,000 People per Square Mile

To confine fires near the room of origin and to treat up to 5 medical patients at once, a multiple-unit response of at least 15 personnel should arrive within 13 minutes total response time from the time of 911 call receipt, 90 percent of the time. This equates to 1 minute dispatch time, 2 minutes crew turnout time and 10 minutes travel time spacing for multiple units. Suburban areas should receive the full first alarm within 14 minutes total response time, 90 percent of the time with the goal to limit the fire spread to the area already involved upon the arrival of the effective response force. For rural areas, this should be 21 minutes, 90 percent of the time. Outcome goals in these areas would be to confine fires to the building of origin and to care for medical patients.

### Goal 5

Hazardous Materials Response

Respond to hazardous materials emergencies with enough trained personnel to protect the community from the hazards associated with the release of hazardous and toxic materials. Achieve a total response time consistent with Goal 1, Goal 2 and Goal 3 with the first company capable of operating at the California OSHA First Responder Operations (FRO) level. After size-up and scene evaluation is complete a determination will be made whether to request the on-duty District Hazardous Materials Team and/or other appropriate resources.

### Goal 6

Technical Rescue

Respond to technical rescue emergencies with enough trained personnel to facilitate a successful rescue. Achieve a total response time consistent with Goal 1, Goal 2 and Goal 3 with the first company capable of operating at the California Rescue System 1 (RS1) level. After size-up and scene evaluation is complete a determination will be made whether to request the on-duty District Rescue Team and/or other appropriate resources.

### Goal 7

Call processing and turnout times

A concentrated focus will be placed on systems, training and feedback measures to crews to lower dispatch and turnout time reflex measures to national best practices of 1 minute for dispatch and 2 minutes for fire crew turnout, 90 percent of the time.

### Goal 8

Effective Response Force for Advanced Life Support (ALS) Medical Emergencies

To treat medical patients requiring advanced procedures and skills (defined as Charlie, Delta or Echo), a two-unit response consisting of one paramedic-staffed ambulance and one additional paramedic-staffed unit for a response force of at least five personnel should arrive within 6 minutes travel time in urban areas and 7 minutes travel time in suburban areas, 90 percent of the time. For rural areas, excluding Mt. Diablo State Park, personnel should arrive within 18 minutes travel time 90 percent of the time.


- Hiring process for Permit Technician positions completed, both new Permit Technicians through Permit Technician course. Internal training ongoing.



- Continued development of June 30, 2017 Comprehensive Annual Financial Report: financial statements, Management's Discussion and Analysis (MD&A), footnotes, required supplemental information, and statistical section.
- Assisted NBS Government Finance Group with the District's annual GEMT ("Ground Emergency Medical Transport") Cost Report submittal for additional \$82,000 of Federal reimbursement associated with MediCal transports.
- CCCERA has released the Fiscal Year (FY) 2018/19 retirement rates. Employer rates for safety (legacy rates) decline approximately 2%, while non-safety (legacy rates) decrease by approximately 0.67%. The employee basic rate remains the same, while the employee COLA (cost of living adjustment) rates that employees are responsible for increases approximately 0.47%. The rate decrease results in a projected net decrease in retirement cost of approximately \$450,000 beginning in FY2018/19 due to positive investment gains. CCCERA rates are subject to possible further revision.

#### Objective

The objective of the CERBT Strategy 1 portfolio is to seek returns that reflect the broad investment performance of the financial markets through capital appreciation and investment income. There is no guarantee that the portfolio will achieve its investment objective.

#### Strategy

The CERBT Strategy 1 portfolio is invested in various asset classes in percentages approved by the CalPERS Board. The specific percentages of portfolio assets allocated to each asset class are shown under "Composition". Generally, equities are intended to help build the value of the employer's portfolio over the long term while bonds are intended to help provide income and stability of principal. Also, strategies invested in a higher percentage of equities seek higher investment returns (but assume more risk) compared with strategies invested in a higher percentage of bonds.

Compared with CERBT Strategy 2 and Strategy 3, this portfolio consists of a higher percentage of equities than bonds and other assets. Historically, equities have displayed greater price volatility and therefore this portfolio may experience greater fluctuation of value. Employers that seek higher investment returns, and are able to accept greater risk and tolerate more fluctuation in returns, may wish to consider this portfolio.

CalPERS Board may change the list of approved asset classes, in composition as well as targeted allocation percentages and ranges at any time.

#### **Assets Under Management**

As of the specifed reporting month-end, the aggregate total of assets under management for all CERBT Strategies was

\$7,513,213,616.



#### **General Information**

#### Information Accessibility

The CERBT Strategy 1 portfolio consists of assets managed internally by CalPERS and/or external advisors. Since it is not a mutual fund, a prospectus is not available nor is information available from a newspaper source. This summary is designed to provide descriptive information. CalPERS provides a quarterly statement of the employer's account and other information about the CERBT. For total market value, detailed asset allocation, investment policy and current performance information, including performance to the most recent month-end, please visit our website at: www.calpers.ca.gov.

#### **Portfolio Manager Information**

The CalPERS Investment Committee and Board of Administration directs the investment strategy and investments of the CERBT. Under that direction, CalPERS Investment staff manages fixed income, treasuery inflation-protected securities and commodities assets; and State Street Global Advisors (SSGA) manages the global equity and real estate investment trust assets.

#### **Custodian and Record Keeper**

State Street Bank serves as custodian for the CERBT. Northeast Retirement Services serves as record keeper.

#### **Expenses**

CERBT is a self-funded trust in which participating employers pay for all administrative and investment expenses. Expenses reduce the gross investment return by the fee amount. The larger the fee, the greater the reduction of investment return. Currently, CERBT expenses are 0.10% which consist of administrative expenses borne by CalPERS to administer and oversee the Trust assets, investment management and administrative fees paid to SSGA to manage the global equity and real estate trust assets, and recordkeeping fees paid to Northeast Retirement Services to administer individual employer accounts. The expenses described herein are reflected in the net asset value per share. CERBT's actual expenses may differ from the amount currently being accrued due to factors such as changes in average fund assets or market conditions. The expense accrual rate may change without notice in order to reflect changes in average portfolio assets or in expense amounts. The CalPERS Board annually reviews the operating expenses and changes may be made as appropriate. Even if the portfolio loses money during a period, the fee is still charged.

#### What Employers Own

Each employer choosing CERBT Strategy 1 owns a percentage of this portfolio, which invests in pooled asset classes managed by CalPERS and/or external advisors. Employers do not have direct ownership of the securities in the portfolio.

#### **Price**

The value of the portfolio changes daily, based upon the market value of the underlying securities. Just as prices of individual securities fluctuate, the portfolio's value also changes with market conditions.

#### **Principal Risks of the Portfolio**

The CalPERS CERBT Fund provides California government employers with a trust through which they may prefund retiree medical costs and other postemployment benefits. CERBT is not, however, a defined benefit plan. There is no guarantee that the portfolio will achieve its investment objectives nor provide sufficient funding to meet these employer obligations. Further, CalPERS will not make up the difference between actual health care premiums for payment of future benefits provided to retirees should CERBT assets not be sufficient to cover future obligations.

An investment in the portfolio is not a bank deposit, and it is not insured nor guaranteed by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC), CalPERS, the State of California or any other government agency.

There are risks associated with investing, including possible loss of principal. The portfolio's risk depends in part on the portfolio's asset class allocations and the selection, weighting and risks of the underlying investments.
